### What's a 4-11 Club?

A 4-H Club provides positive youth development opportunities for young people to experience belonging, mastery, independence, and generosity. Clubs meet a minimum of 6 times per year. Below are the different types of clubs 4-H offers:

**Community Clubs**- Members are typically from the same area, who come together to learn new things, work on projects they're interested in, and help their community.

**Project Club**- These clubs focus on a specific topic or skill, such as robotics, shooting sports, livestock, etc. They meet regularly to learn more about their projects, work on activities, and master their skills in that area.

**SPARK Club**- These are special interest groups designated to "spark" an interest in different subjects. They include six hours of instructional time which may occur in one day or over a length of time. Examples of past Spark Clubs we've had include Tae-Kwon-Do, Hiking, Dance, or Sewing!

### Who Can Join 4-11?

Harrison County 4-H is open to **ALL** youth in grades K - 12 who reside in Harrison County. Youth who live in other counties may join if they have interest in a program not offered in their home county upon the approval of the 4-H Educator.

## Who are the Junior Leaders?

The 4-H Junior Leader program focuses on the development of leadership skills, as well as community involvement and service, life skills, and camaraderie. 4-H members in grades 7-12 are welcome to join. Junior Leaders serve as mentors and role models to younger 4-H

members by sharing their experiences and involvement in 4-H. Junior Leaders sharpen their leadership skills by conducting their own meetings, leading workshops and project nights, and have the opportunity to take lead in organizing events throughout the county.

### Community Service

Junior Leaders have the opportunity to participate in various community service initiatives. These may include, but are not limited to...

### Mentorship

Junior Leaders act as mentors and role models for younger 4-H members, sharing their experiences, guiding activities and lessons, and providing assistance throughout the program year. These young leaders set the example for future leaders in 4-H.

- Assisting in workshops and project nights for younger 4-H members

## 4-H Enrollment

## 4-11 Online: Step by Step Enrollment Guide

### **Creating A New Account:**

- 1. Go to v2.4HOnline.com.
- 2. Click "Don't have an account?" if you have never enrolled in 4-H before using 4-H Online.
- 3. Select Indiana from the drop-down menu (select Indiana 4-H Youth Development).
- 4. Choose your county from the drop-down menu.
- 5. Complete your family's information.
- 6. Click the Create Account button.
- 7. Enter your family's address information.
- 8. Click the Verify button.
- 9. If you create a new account and an existing account is found, click the Confirm button and continue to Logging in with an existing 4-H Online account.

If you are **returning** to 4-H, your member record will be listed on the Family Member List. Click "Enroll Now" under 4-H. If you are a new member and your name is not yet listed, click "Add Member" and follow the steps for "Adding a New Family Member," then continue to Step 1 below.

- 1. Select the member's Grade and click Next.
- 2. Select to Confirm that you would like to enroll as a Club Member.
- 3. Click the Select Clubs button.
- 4. Select the County in which your Club is located.
- 5. Click Add next to the Club you would like to join.
- 6. Repeat steps 1-3 to add all of the Clubs in which you would like to participate.
- 7. If you have enrolled in more than one club, be sure the Primary club is marked correctly. If not, click the Change to Primary button to mark a different Club as your Primary Club.
- 8. Click the trash can icon to remove a Club from the list.
- 9. Once all of your Clubs are added, click Next at the bottom of the screen.
- 10. Click Select Projects.
- 11. Select the Club with which you want your project to be associated.
- 12. Click the Add button next to the project you want to add to the member's enrollment.
- 13. Repeat steps 10-12 for each project in which you would like to participate.
- 14. Click the trash can icon to remove any projects.
- 15. Click the Next button once all the member's projects have been added.
- 16. Click "Show Questions"
- 17. Complete the enrollment questions. Some of the questions will be completed for you based on what you entered when you created your record.
- 18. Complete the Health form fields and Consents.
- 19. Click the Next button at the bottom of the screen when you are done.
- 20. Complete the Consents
- 21. Click the Next button at the bottom of the page when you are finished.
- 22. Make sure you choose "Pay by Check" and do NOT put in credit card information. Enrollment fees are covered by the Harrison County 4-H Council!
- 23. Review the enrollment information.
- 24. Once you have verified that the clubs and projects are listed correctly, click the Submit button.

You will receive an email to let you know your enrollment has been submitted. You will receive another email when your County Extension office has approved your enrollment. You may view the enrollment status on the Member List. Please make sure you are choosing to pay by check, as the Harrison County 4-H Council is covering fees for the 2024-2025 4-H program year!

## Mini 4-11

### What is Mini 4-11?

Mini 4-H is a noncompetitive 4-H program for youth in grades K-2.

Mini 4-H is designed to introduce you and your child to the 4-H program and is an excellent way for children to learn by doing and to exhibit projects at the Fair. Mini 4-H members also have the opportunity to attend club meetings, workshops, and a summer day camp just for Mini 4-H'ers. There is no limit to the number of projects youth can sign up for, however, try not to overwhelm a child with too many projects.

The noncompetitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

- Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active
  and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing
  a specific product or exhibit.
- Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual positive encouragement and assistance.
- Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
- Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
- Rewards are identical ribbons of the same color for everyone.

### **BICYCLE:**

Learn bicycle safety, all about road signs and the parts of your bicycle.



### FOODS:

Make your own trail mix, cook nobake cookies and bake with biscuits! Learn how to make great treats your family will love.



### PHOTOGRAPHY:

Learn the Do's and Don'ts of taking pictures and how to get that perfect shot. Learn about close-ups, landscapes, portraits, and more!



### **CRAFTS:**

Do you like to paint, draw, play with clay and use your hands to create crafty things? This is the project for you!



#### **FORESTRY:**

Learn about different trees and what makes them special.

## Volunteer Corner

## What is a 4-11 Volunteer?


