

Rooted in Service: Extension Homemakers Gather for Annual May Celebration

On May 13, 2025, the Harrison County Extension Homemakers held their annual May Achievement Day with the theme "Back Home Again in Harrison County." The event welcomed 42 attendees for a day of remembrance, recognition, and community celebration.

Highlights included a memorial service for members lost over the past year and reflections from each club on their annual achievements. Scholarships were awarded to Camille Coffman, Gracelyn Burks, Frankie Wilkerson, Isabelle Abner, and Brady Sieg, funded by the annual Pie Contest and Auction at the Harrison County Fair.

A special moment came when Shepherd of the Hills presented a \$500 donation to support the Extension Homemakers' First Books program, which provides free books to local Harrison County youth. Their contribution helps ensure continued access to early literacy resources for children in the community.

Guest speaker Lee King, of Repair Affair of Harrison County, shared about efforts to assist elderly and disabled residents with critical home repairs—an effort supported by Extension Homemakers through homemade cookie donations. Tara Beckman presented on spring superfoods, highlighting the health benefits of eating locally grown, seasonal produce. The event concluded with the installation of 2025–26 officers, milestone member recognition, and the announcement of Cultural Arts and State Project winners, Marcia Gliottone and Lydia Robertson, who will be showcased at the upcoming IEHA Home and Family State Conference in June.

The day highlighted the Homemakers' continued commitment to leadership, education, and service throughout Harrison County.
