IMPORTANT UPDATES

1. STATE FAIR UPDATE: 4-H Exhibitors in beef cattle, dairy cattle, sheep, swine, meat goats, dairy goats, rabbits and poultry need to bring a copy of their current YQCA certificate with them to the Indiana State Fair. It's acceptable to bring paper print-out or a picture on your smart phone or other device. Certification will be verified during the check-in process and a copy of your certificate will help ensure that this process goes as quickly and efficiently as possible. You can access your certificate by logging into your YQCA account at vgca.org.

2. STATE FAIR UPDATE: New for 2021: A separate affidavit will be required for each event a 4-H member enters. For example, if an affidavit is submitted by the 4-H member exhibiting barrows then a new affidavit will be required if they are also exhibiting gilts the following weekend.

Affidavits are required for 4-H Beef Cattle, Dairy Cattle, Swine, Sheep, Dairy Goats, Boer Goats and Meat Goats. See attachment for more details!




2022 4-H T-Shirt Contest

Rules:

- 3. Designs should be submitted on the form below using only one color of ink. This form will also be available on our website: https://extension.purdue.edu/hendricks.
- 4. The 4-H Clover must follow proper Clover usage guidelines that can be found here: https://nifa.usda.gov/resource/4-h-name-and-emblem.
- 5. Depending on the design and what the printers are capable of, the final design may need to be slightly tweaked to fit the shirt.

Clean Sweep 2021

WHAT:

An **Indiana Pesticide Clean Sweep Project** designed to collect and dispose of suspended, canceled, banned, unusable, opened, unopened or just unwanted **pesticides** (weed killers, insecticides, rodenticides, fungicides, miticides, etc.) is being sponsored by the Office of Indiana State Chemist (OISC). This disposal service is free of charge up to 250 pounds per participant. Over 250 pounds there will be a \$2.00 per pound charge. This is a great opportunity for you to legally dispose of unwanted products at little or no cost.

WHO:

All public and private schools, golf courses, nurseries, farmers, ag dealers, cities, towns, municipalities and county units of government or others receiving this notice are eligible to participate.

9:00am to 3:00pm Local Time

HOW:

Complete the enclosed **Pesticide Clean Sweep Planning Form** to the best of your ability. Mail, fax or e-mail the completed form to Nathan Davis at 765-494-4331 or cleansweep@groups.purdue.edu no later than **Fri., August 6, 2021.** Then bring your labeled, leak free and safe to transport containers to the collection site. DO NOT mix materials. In case of an emergency, you should bring with you a list of products you are carrying and a contact phone number.

COVID-19 Guidelines: When you arrive to drop off materials please stay in your vehicle and a team member will check you in. We will be unloading one vehicle at a time to maintain physical distancing.

*NOTE: OISC reserves the right to cancel this Pesticide Clean Sweep Project if there is not adequate demand. Participants submitting the enclosed planning form by <u>August 6, 2021</u> will be contacted immediately if cancellation is necessary.
