### **Teacher Grant Updates**

We are off to a great start with several really deserving and qualified applications. This has been a tough job for the Grant Committee to pick just one winner per month. However, we have picked our recipients for September and October.

The September Grant has been awarded to Abby McAfee at Danville North Elementary. Abby is a kindergarten and first grade Behavior/Support teacher. She has taught kindergarten for 10 years and has just transitioned into her new role this year. Her grant will be used to purchase many necessary items needed for her new classroom. She will be purchasing sensory items such as fidgets, calming tools, and equipment that helps students manage their emotions and energy levels throughout the day. This will allow students to engage in learning more successfully.

The October Grant has been awarded to Scotty Stepp at Cascade High School. Scotty teaches the new 11 & 12 grade Construction Trades class. This is the first year for this class. The students learn carpentry skills and then can pursue a career pathway in Carpentry after graduation. The grant will be used to purchase needed supplies such as wood glue, paint brushes, impact drill driver bits, brad nails, screws, and pencils. Scotty said this grant will go a long way in providing the students with much needed supplies.

The program for this concert has not been determined, but last June the program included the 1812 Overture, the Stars and Stripes Forever, The Battle Hymn of the Republic, and America the Beautiful. It is anticipated that the 2026 concert will include most of this music and other patriotic pieces. The Hendricks County Chorus will also perform.

The concert is two hours in length with an additional 20-minute intermission. Concessions are available, but only credit card purchases are accepted. Free parking is available at the Plainfield Downtown Parking Structure at 125 N Center St, Plainfield, IN 46168. ADA parking is available in the parking lot directly behind the Town of Plainfield Government Center at 206 W Main St Plainfield..

All tickets are the same price regardless of where you sit. Ticket prices for the June concert have yet to be determined and tickets will not be available to purchase until April 1. The price will be set

the first part of February. More information with a payment/reservation form will be e-mailed to each member, including mailbox members, in February and will be in the Homemakers' Happenings in February. If a club member does not have e-mail, please see they get this information. Once you receive the information you will have approximately one month to return the payment/reservation form.

There are only two performances of this concert, and they sell out very quickly. Therefore, tickets will be purchased on April 1. The theater will have a list of those who have purchased tickets. You will go to the Will Call

Window at the theater just before the concert to pick-up your ticket. The building opens one hour before the concert. Theater doors opens 30 minutes before the concert.



#### **Fall Harvest Snack Mix**

### Ingredients:

3 cups Peanut Butter Chex Cereal

2 cups Wheat Chex Cereal

2 cups "Itty Bitty" pretzels

2 cups Goldfish crackers (Cheddar)

2 cups Honey Nut Cheerios

2 cups peanuts

2/3 cup unsalted butter melted

2/3 cup light brown sugar packed

2 tablespoons maple syrup

1 teaspoon kosher salt

1/2 teaspoon cinnamon

1 cup candy corn

1 cup Reese's Pieces

2 cups Marshmallows (optional)

#### Directions . . .

- Begin by preheating your oven to 275 degrees F. Line a large baking pan (15x11) with parchment paper or two cookie sheets. Set aside.
- In a large bowl toss together the first 6 ingredients.
- In a small bowl whisk together the melted butter, brown sugar, maple syrup, salt, and cinnamon. Pour this mixture over the first 6 ingredients and stir evenly to coat.
- Spread this mixture onto the prepared baking sheets. Bake for about 45 minutes or until things start to turn a golden brown. Stir every 10 minutes. (If you use two cookie sheets, cook for 30 minutes.) Remove from the oven and cool completely.
- Stir in the final three ingredients. (Since the marshmallows dry out quickly, I'd only add them as you eat the snack mix. You could put in a little into your bowl instead of mixing them all together.)
- Enjoy immediately or store in an airtight container for up to 1 week.
