PLEASE use the same profile you signed up with in 2022/2023. Even for Mini! DO NOT create a new one. Please pay attention to your years in 4-H.

\*Payment (for grades 3 - 12) is due by January 25, 2024. You are NOT a 4-H member until you have paid the State Program Fee. Paying on line with a valid credit/debit card is the quickest and easiest way to become active. Otherwise, cash or check payments are due in the office by January 25, 2024. We are unable to take card payments over the phone.

4-H Auction Appraisal Checks . . . If you have not yet cashed your appraisal check (market value) of your animal sold in the 4-H Fair Auction, do so immediately. Our banks must finalize these accounts as soon as possible: Beef, Goat, Rabbit, Sheep & Swine (Huntington Co 4-H Fair Auction Account)

As for premium value checks, it is the 4-H members' responsibility to contact the buyer of your auction animal to secure that money. DO NOT assume the business. organization or individual will automatically mail the premium money to you. Your personal "thank you" in addition to a written note is very important to the continuing support of many buyers and donors to our 4-H program.

# NEPAC Field Day – Wednesday, September 13

Purdue Extension in northeast Indiana will host a field day on September 13 for farmers and agribusiness professionals highlighting current agronomic research. The field day will be held at Northeast Purdue Agricultural Center (NEPAC), 4821 E. 400 S, Columbia City, IN.

The program begins with a series of morning workshops led by Purdue Extension experts. Workshop topics and presenters include:

- \* Update on Weeds in Field Crops, by Bill Johnson and/or Marcelo Zimmer, Purdue Extension weed science specialists
- \* Field Applications with UAVs (Spray & Cover Crops), by Mark Carter, Purdue Extension Educator and state UAV program coordinator
- \* Capturing Manure Nutrients Through Application to Growing Crops, by Glen Arnold, Assoc. Professor, Field Specialist, Manure Nutrient Management, The Ohio State University
- \* Update on Field Crops Diseases, by Darcy Telenko, Purdue Extension field crops pathologist

An optional afternoon demonstration session will be available on semi D.O.T. inspections, by state trooper, Jason Ward.

Participants can receive private applicator recertification program credit. Indiana Corn Marketing Council and Indiana Soybean Alliance will be sponsoring the individual \$10 fee. Commercial applicator CCHs and Certified Crop Adviser CEUs are anticipated to be available.

Registration, refreshments and vendor visits will take place from 8:00 to 8:30 a.m. The program will run from 8:30 a.m. to 1:15 p.m., with lunch provided through the generous support of agribusiness sponsors. The optional afternoon session will be from 1:15-2:30 p.m. Admission is free, but registration is required by Sept. 6 to receive a meal. # 2023 Farmland Values and Cash Rents Survey Report Available

The Purdue Agricultural Economics Department recently released the 2023 Indiana Farmland Values and Cash Rents Survey. Indiana farmland prices once again hit record highs in 2023. Statewide, the average price of top-quality farmland averaged \$13,739 per acre, up 7.3% from June 2022. Average- and poor-quality farmland increased 5.8% and 0.7% to \$11,210 and \$8,689 per acre, respectively.

Per-acre cash rental rates for top-, average- and poor-quality land exceeded the previous highs set in 2013, 2014 and 2021. Indiana per-acre cash rent for top-quality land increased by 1.99% to \$306. Cash rental rates for average- and poor-quality land increased by 2.09% and 2.50% to \$257 and \$212, respectively.
