<u>Job Summary:</u> The Summer Program Assistant is responsible for working with the Extension Office Staff with educational programming, preparation, and implementation of the 4-H programming during the Jackson County Fair. The Summer Program Assistant will work directly with Extension Educators to plan, organize, and implement programs in Extension. Responsibilities are not limited to, but may include the following:

- Assist all Extension Educators, as needed, with educational programs.
- Assist office support staff, as needed, on projects.
- Coordinate educational workshops for various project areas. This includes contacting potential speakers/presenters and/or presenting at workshops.
- Help Extension Educator recruit volunteers and youth, promote, and organize a SPARK club.
- Assist in planning and implementation of Mini 4-H Day Camp and Annual Nature Camp.
- Organize 10 year 4-H Member newspaper information.
- Develop 4-H Recruitment Plan in collaboration with Extension Educator.
- Prepare and organize mailings, notices, educational flyers, etc.
- Organize 4-H project check-in materials.
- Assist with technical aspects of Fair Entry check in/results.
- Assist with 4-H project check-in, judging, displaying, and check-out.
- Assist with delivery of 4-H projects to the Indiana State Fair.

Qualifications: Applicants must be a current college student and preferred study areas are agriculture, education, or health. Applicants must also have good communication skills and basic knowledge of Microsoft Office. Applicants need to be comfortable speaking to the public and representing Purdue Extension in a professional manner.





Entry Deadlines

All beef and dairy beef steers, commercial heifers, registered heifers, and dairy & beef feeder steers must be identified by midnight, May 15th in the 4-H Online system. All animals except cat, dog, and poultry will need to be identified in the 4-H Online system by May 15th. All rabbits must be entered in 4-H Online again this year by the May 15th deadline. Specific instructions will be mailed to all cat, dog, and poultry exhibitors to put their identification information in Fair Entry prior to the fair.

If you choose to utilize YQCA instead, that is acceptable, but you will need to take that course online and upload a copy of your certificate in Fair Entry in June/July.

DNA Hair Samples

INTERMEDIATE CAKE DECORATING WORKSHOP


The intermediate cake decorating workshop took place in March. It was open to grades 6-8.




