

### How to find upcoming PARP or CCH events:

#### **PARP**

- 1. Search 'Purdue Extension PARP Events'
- Select 'PARP Events Purdue University College of Agriculture'
- 3. Either click 'View all PARP events' or scroll down to 'East district', click +, click 'View approved East District PARP events'

### <u>CCH</u>

- 1. Search 'OISC Website'
- 2. Select 'Pesticide' in the orange bar at the top of the page
- 3. Scroll down for 'Find CCH programs for credit'
- 4. On the lefthand side of the page, hover over 'Pesticide programs', select 'CCH courses'
- 5. At the least, select which category of CCHs you are needing and hit 'search'

#### **PARP**

- 1. Search "PARP events Purdue University".
- 2. Select "View all approved PARP events".
- 3. To find events closer to our area, scroll down to "view events by district" and select that option.
- 4. Select "East district".
- 5. Select "View approved East district PARP events"





# Events with the opportunity to obtain continuing credit hours

#### Commercial (CCH)

- 1. Search "Office of the Indiana State Chemist" or "OISC".
- 2. Select "Pesticide".
- 3. Find "Continuing Education (CCH) & Private Applicator Recertification (PARP)".
- 4. Select "CCH Programs for credit".
- 5. Toggle over "Pesticide Programs" and select "CCH Courses".
- 6. Search by the "category" that they need and by the date they need the points.
