Fresh and local produce is coming to a location near you!

From June 1st to September 30th, Purdue Extension and LifeTime Resources will be Extension and Life lime Resources will be partnering with local produce farmers to host Senior Farmers Market Nutrition Program (SFMNP) pop-up markets at the Hanover Branch of the Jefferson County Public Library and the Madison Senior

Eligible seniors are those 60-years-old or older with a gross household income of no more than 185% of current federal poverty income guidelines. Persons with disabilities who are 55-years-old or older AND reside in housing primarily occupied by the elderly AND where congregate nutrition services are provided may also be approved for SFMNP benefits.

The SFMNP benefit is \$50 per eligible individual. Benefits may be used for 30 calendar days.

WIC participants are also invited to use their \$30 eFMNP benefits at these sites!

How do I exhibit my project at the Fair?

Step 1: Enroll on 4-H Online.com

Select projects, clubs, and events

Step 2: Pay your 4-H Dues

- Pay your 4-H member dues online when you enroll or in person at the office.
- You cannot complete your entries without first paying your dues.

Step 3: Register Animals on 4-H Online by May 15th

- Livestock & Horses need to be enrolled online. Cats, Dogs, Poultry and Rabbits do not.
- Dogs, Cats and Horses require Vaccination Forms before they are allowed to participate.

Step 4: Complete Required Trainings COMPLETE

Quality Livestock Care or YQCA is required for Livestock Projects, Rabbits and Poultry.

Step 5: Enter your Projects into the Show Classes and Divisions you want on

Fair Entry.com

Projects and Animals are imported from 4-H Online to Fair Entry. You select Arts and Crafts on 4-H online. Fair Entry is where you decide if its, a model, fine art, needlecraft etc.

Step 6: Enter your Projects on the Dates and times listed on the Fair Schedule. Good Luck!

Fair Entry Opens June 1!- Entry Deadline June 24

Fair Entry is the final step in getting your projects ready for the fair. This system takes all of the information you entered into 4-H Online and lets you sign up for the classes and divisions you will exhibit at the fair. This is the system we use to build livestock show schedules and print entry tags. Please help us by completing fair entry by June 24, 2025!

If you do not fill out Fair Entry by June 24th your name will not appear on the pen request sheets, won't be listed in livestock show bills and you will have to go to the extension office to fill out fair entry on Project Check In Day, which will slow down the process. We understand that finding reliable internet access is a challenge. Please call the Extension Office at (812) 265-8919 or stop by before June 24th so we can enter your divisions and projects for you.

You cannot register your project on the Fair Entry website if you have not paid the State Program fee and been marked "active" on 4-HOnline.

- 8. If this is an animal entry, after you select your club you will enter your animal. When adding an animal entry.
 - i. Use "Choose and Existing Animal Record"-SWINE, CAT-TLE, HORSE, SHEEP, GOATS
 - ii. Use "Enter a New animal record" -RABBITS, POULTRY, DOG, CAT
- 13. Enter a Description for a non-animal entry.
- 14. Click Continue. At this point you can:
 - a. Add another Entry-for this child
 - b. Add another Entry for this Division-same child, same division
 - c. Register another exhibitor-new child
 - d. Continue to payment- Click this when you have completed all entries for all children. All entries are free, no payment needed.
- 16. Review your entries, click Submit
- 17. Make sure you make it to the THANKS! page. You're Done!

Project Spotlight: Electric

The 4-H electricity/electronics program provides youth with educational information about electricity and how it can be used to benefit the human race. The electricity/electronics program develops project skills (i.e., safe practices, proper use of fuses and circuit breakers, proper lighting techniques, proper wiring techniques) and life skills (i.e., decision-making, using science and technology, developing communication skills). These fun-filled, hands-on learning experiences are provided under the direction of caring adults. 

Homegrown 4-H Club Food Pantry Garden

Homegrown 4-H Club Awarded Indiana 4-H Foundation YES Grant

The Homegrown 4-H Club is proud to announce that their Food Pantry Garden has been awarded a Youth Engaged Service (YES) Grant from the Indiana 4-H Foundation, sponsored by Corteva AgriScience and Rural First by Farm Credit. The YES Grant recognizes outstanding youth-led service projects across Indiana that are planned, budgeted, and implemented by 4-H members.



In addition to awarding grants, the nonprofit Indiana 4-H Foundation provides financial support for 4-H youth develop-

ment programming all across the state of Indiana. It receives funding from individuals, corporations, granting agencies, and through sales of the Indiana 4-H license plate, which also benefit Indiana 4-H programs in each county where the plates are sold. In 2024, the **Madison Community Grocery Project** sponsored and installed two raised garden beds behind the Jefferson County Extension Office. These beds yielded over **75 pounds of fresh produce**—all donated to the House of Hope Food Pantry in Madison. Thanks to additional support from the YES Grant, the partnership will **expand in 2025**, with **two more raised beds** being added to **double** the produce donated.



Opportunity for more clubs to get involved!



As the garden grows, so does the need for

helping hands. The **Homegrown 4-H Club** invites other 4-H clubs in Jefferson County to "**adopt**" one of the new garden beds. This would not be a financial commitment, just time! A weekly sign up schedule to water, and weed is linked in this letter. The garden's needs the most attention in the late summer after fair when produce needs to be taken to the food bank as it ripens. The garden is off to a slow start this year because of the weather but it will be growing in no time.

This is a great opportunity for club leaders to incorporate hands-on learning into their **monthly meetings**, especially if your club meets at the fairgrounds. The **Junior Master Gardener curriculum and games** are available upon request—just contact the Extension Office for support.
