

Clean Water Indiana Grant AVAILABLE

The Jefferson, Clark and Scott County SWCD's have been awarded a 2025 Clean Water Indiana Grant. This grant is for \$130,000 for up to a three year period for three county area or until the money is all allocated. This project will strive to promote soil health on pasture/hay land, and improve water quality. Conservation practices will be installed that help to: improve pasture and hay quality; reduce soil erosion and compaction; reduce excessive nutrients and sediments in surface and ground water; and improve inadequate feed, forage, and water. Cover crops are included as they reduce erosion and diminish sediment entering our water, and they can be grazed as part of a pasture management plan.

Interested parties need to complete an application and a ranking form for cost-share assistance.

- Property must be located in Jefferson, Clark or Scott County, Indiana.
- Receipts, seed tags and other documents need to be submitted for payment as soon as the practices are completed.
- All practices must be completed within 12 months of application approval. Except for the year 2027 and all practices have to be complete and receipts submitted for payment by November 30, 2027.


4-H Enrollment Continues- Office is here to help




Virtual Club Officer Training from Purdue Collegiate 4-H on March 11th

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Livestock Exhibitor To Do List <

To exhibit an animal in 4-H there are a couple extra steps you need to take to be ready for the showring. This year we are hosting a workshop to help you become beyond ready to show. Here are a few reminders to keep you up to date.

Tag your Livestock

Beef Tagging—April 5, 2025, 7 -10 am on the Fairgrounds

Any youth planning to show a beef steer, heifer, and or dairy steer at the 4-H County Fair must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Dairy Females and previously shown heifers with appropriate identification information do not need to attend.

Sheep, Goat, Swine Tagging—April 26, 2025, 7 -10 am on the Fairgrounds

Any youth planning to show sheep, goats, or swine must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/ identification. Previously shown females that have the proper ID do not need to attend.

Complete a required Indiana 4-H **Quality Livestock Care Training**

In person QLC trainings are required for exhibition of all livestock projects. If you are unable to make any of the dates you can complete YQCA training online at yqcaprogram.org and email proof of completion to the extension office. You only need to take this training once a year and it counts for all species you might show. Trainings cost \$3 and registration is collected on 4-H online events.

1st Training Opportunity at Area 1 Beyond Ready to Show Livestock Workshop-March 29 on the Fairgrounds. This training is free if registered for the workshop.

2nd Training and 4-H Online Animal ID Help Night- May 15 @ 6 pm in the Community Bldg.

3rd Training Opportunity - June 24th @ Noon in the Community Bldg.

Enter your Show Classes on Fair Entry

Fair entry is the last step before your enter the show ring. Fair Entry will open June 1 and close June 24.

Enroll your Animals on 4-H Online by May 15th

Just like leaders and 4-H members Animals must be registered on 4-H online to show. Our office will enroll the animals for you if you stop at the office on your way out of tagging days. All animals except rabbits, chickens, dogs & cats must be enrolled on 4HOnline.

Attend a Livestock Workshop & skip the record sheets!

Livestock record sheets are required to receive premium money after showing at the fair. If you attend an educational workshop on your species you do not have to complete any record sheets at all! You can complete any counties program, any time. Our Beyond Ready Livestock Workshop has us excited. Two past Jefferson County 4-H Judges will be presenting and the workshop offers a QLC training so it's a one stop shop!


