Don't Forget! Livestock Tagging is right around the corner!

Beef Tagging—April 20, 2024, 7-10 am on the Fairgrounds

Save the date! Any youth planning to show a beef steer, heifer, and or dairy steer at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Dairy Females and previously shown and tagged females with appropriate registration/identification information do not need to come to tagging.

Sheep, Goat, Swine Tagging—May 11 2024, 7 -10 am on the Fairgrounds

Save the date! Any youth planning to show sheep, goats, or swine at the 4-H County Fair this summer must bring their animals to the Fairgrounds for tagging/identification. Previously shown females that have the proper ID do not need to come to tagging.

Manuals, Project Books and Record Sheets

As we transition this year to being record sheet free (horray!) for all static projects we have had a couple questions come up, primarily about premium money, green folders and when to turn in livestock records.

Premium money is calculated by the highest premium ribbon as recorded in Fair Entry for each project. There is no need to turn in any paper work on project check in day except skill sheets, and recipe cards directly to the judge for your project.

Livestock Record Sheets or Livestock Record Sheet Alternatives can be turned in at the same time you pick up your premium money, Thursday of Fair. Please make sure your Fair Entry is correct to expedite this process.


The Project Books for poster projects are additional supplements and are not required to complete your project. All you need is in your 4-H Handbook or online at https://extension.purdue.edu/4-H

FAMACHA CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

SMALL RUMINANT PRODUCERS & FOR 4-H MEMBERS AGE 13 AND UP May 15, 2024 at the Jefferson County 4-H Fairgrounds

FAMACHA© is a diagnostic test to help small ruminant producers identify animals that require anthelmintic treatment and those which do not require deworming. The tool is a card that matches lower eyelid color to anemia levels, an indicator of clinical barber pole worm infection.

This training is open to 4-H members and the general public. The event will be followed by a Indiana Quality Livestock Care Training (the required training for Indiana 4-H Livestock Exhibitors) so 4-H Families can get the most out of their evening. Participants must be 13 years of age to receive the certification.

Registration is required to attend and space is limited.


