Fall Pruning and Planting for Indiana Gardens

Fall is quickly approaching, bringing cooler temperatures, refreshing rains, and fewer pests. It's a perfect time to tackle garden tasks, from pruning perennials to planting vegetables.

Pruning

Fall is a good time to prune out dead, damaged, or diseased plant material. You can also tidy up perennials that have finished blooming and make light shaping cuts on shrubs. Consider saving some stems when cutting back the spent blooms of herbaceous perennials. When left standing, these stems provide habitat for pollinators and food for wildlife while also adding winter interest to a garden that may otherwise remain empty for the cold months ahead.

Do not prune spring-blooming shrubs such as lilacs, forsythia, or spicebush in the fall, otherwise you'll cut off next year's flower buds. The bigleaf and oakleaf hydrangea also produce blooms on old wood. These are best pruned immediately after flowering. Always use sharp, clean tools and cut just above a bud or branch junction at a slight angle. For pruning best practices along with a comprehensive list of recommended pruning times for common woody perennials, refer to Pruning Ornamental Trees and Shrubs.

Planting

Fall is prime time to plant hardy perennials, trees, and shrubs. The soil remains warm long after the air temperature drops, giving roots time to establish before the ground freezes. Aim to finish planting by mid-to-late October in most parts of Indiana. Consider natives such as purple coneflower (Fig. 4), serviceberry, or buttonbush for low-maintenance beauty. It's also the season for planting bulbs for spring blooms and vegetables for a fall harvest. Tulips, daffodils, and crocus should be planted before the soil freezes to provide a burst of early spring color. You can also sow quick-growing cool-season vegetables like leaf lettuce, spinach, and radishes for a fall harvest. Check out **The Fall Vegetable Garden** for a planting guide on coolseason vegetables.

Prep for Winter Protection & Spring Success

Trees, shrubs, and perennials should continue to be irrigated deeply up until the ground freezes. Add a layer of mulch after the soil cools to insulate roots from harsh temperature swings. Be sure to keep mulch a few inches away from tree trunks or shrub stems to prevent rot or rodent damage . Winterize Your Trees offers more tips on protecting your perennials from the often frigid and dry conditions of an Indiana winter


Save the Dates!

4-H Club Leader Representative Position

It is time to appoint a new 4-H Leader Representative to the Jefferson County 4-H Fair Board. The purpose of this position is to represent the interests of 4-H Club leaders as a voting member on the Fair Board. This person is expected to fulfill Fair Board member duties in addition to working with Extension Educators to gather needs assessment data, promote 4-H volunteer training opportunities, serve as a mentor to beginning 4-H leaders, and be a point of contact for 4-H leaders in addition to Extension Educators.

This position is open to 4-H volunteers who were in active status on 4-H Online within the 2024 -2025 4-H program year. This position is appointed annually and can serve for 2 consecutive terms. Volunteer Role Descriptions and Screenings Process continues.

If you are unsure of your volunteer role on 4-Honline reach out to the office for help. We greatly appreciate your time making sure our program is in compliance with state requirements.

Step 1: Choose Volunteer Type:

Club Volunteer

- Choose this if you are a leader of a club such as Hanover No Names or Jefferson County 4-H Southpaws
 - On the second drop down choose <u>Club Organizational Member.</u>
- Also choose this if you are on the Fair Board or Extension Board Member.
 - On the second drop down chose 4-H Affiliate Member.

• Program Volunteer

- If you are just a cool guy that likes to lift gates, weed the tomatoes and do whatever is needed and don't belong to a club choose this option.
 - On the second drop down select **General Program Volunteer.**

• Project Volunteer

- If you are a project **superintendent** for livestock or the exhibit hall select this role
 - On the second drop down select <u>Subject Matter/Project Leader</u>. Then add your projects on the third drop down list.
- New Applicant

 This is pretty self explanatory. If you have never volunteered before select this option.

After you have signed your role description and your normal consents it will say "Submit Enrollment" You are not complete after this step!

<u>Step 2:</u> A second screen will ask you to consent to screening (background checks). It's essential you click <u>show screening questions</u>, complete them and then advance.

<u>Step 3:</u> Last are your normal training videos you complete every year. After those three steps you are done!

Hello all,

I hope that this message finds you well. Today, I am reaching out regarding updates to the Purdue Extension Nutrition Education Program and my position.

On July 3, 2025, federal legislation (H.R.1 Sec 10107) was passed that eliminates all SNAP-Ed funding nationwide, effective September 30, 2025. As a result, SNAP-Ed programming delivered through Purdue Extension's Nutrition Education Program (NEP) will be phased out over the coming month and the overall scope of NEP services will be reduced. I am writing to share that my position will be eliminated due to this reduction in SNAP-Ed funding. My last day with Purdue Extension NEP is August 15th, 2025.

While my position will no longer be here, I am incredibly thankful for the community partners, volunteers, and coworkers that will continue efforts to improve access to physical activity and nutrition opportunities locally. From first serving as the 4-H/HHS Educator to now working as the Community Wellness Coordinator, I have felt blessed to serve the Jefferson County community for the last four years. I am leaving this work having established lasting impacts, formed excellent partnerships, and made forever friends. I will always be thankful for my time working in this role, and I look forward to what is ahead.


