

Nature of Teaching

The Boys & Girls Club Country Squire Lakes and North Vernon Elementary locations participated in a week-long nature week last month. The Nature of Teaching program is developed by Purdue University to allow students to learn about bird Identification and facts, taste different parts of garden plants, tree identification and facts, habitats in nature, and then a nature hike to apply all they learned throughout the week. This was a huge success and serving roughly 50 students daily.

Garden Club at the Boys & Girls Club

As the summer Boys & Girls Club wraps up this week, our official weekly garden club has come to an end at CSL. Throughout the summer the students planted a garden, raising plants for produce, and learned information on: insects, pollinators, where seeds come from, and composting. It has been fun to see the kid's knowledge and excitement grow each week throughout these summer lessons.

Be Aware of Parasites in Your Animals

As we approach mid to late summer, it is important to check your livestock for parasites as it can lead to the death of your livestock if not treated. There are many types of parasites located in different livestock so it is important to know what types to be able to treat properly. You can find this information by conducting a fecal egg count, which we do here at the Jennings County Purdue Extension Office. 
CAL EGG COUNTS

WHY SHOULD I GET A FECAL EGG COUNT ON MY LIVESTOCK?

Extension

- Fecal Egg Counts assess your livestock's parasite burden and target the parasite your livestock might be suffering from at the time of collection.
- Use gloves to collect a fresh sample of feces from your livestock. The sample should still be both moist and soft. It should be collected and turned into the office no more than 6 hours from the time of defecation
- Label the bag with the species of livestock that the sample came from and the animal's identification.




Nutrition Education Program Advisor
