Purpose of Individual Kosciusko County 4-H Individual Scholarships & Awards

ANGLIN-BISHOP AWARD

This award was created in memory of two Jr. Leaders, Mike Bishop and Jeremiah Anglin, who passed away during their 4-H careers. It is meant to recognize a Jr. Leader who exemplifies what it means to be a Jr. Leader, 4-H member and for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our Jr. Leader program.

BOB STIFFLER 4-H BEEF SCHOLARSHIP

The Bob Stiffler 4-H Beef Scholarship was established by the Kosciusko County Cattlemen's in honor of Bob's outstanding contribution to the beef industry the county. The goal of the scholarship is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member(s) in the Beef project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H Beef and Dairy Steer projects by awarding a scholarship(s) for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

TOM SMITH AND RUDY ROSS

The Tom Smith Memorial Scholarship award is given in memory of Tom Smith. Tom was a Kosciusko County farmer. Two of his greatest loves were the county fair and showing sheep.

GENE MILNER MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Gene Milner was the first pistol instructor in the Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Program. The Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Committee created the scholarship after Gene passed away very unexpectedly. The goal is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Shooting Sports project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H shooting sports project by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

JAY HAAB MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

The Jay Haab Memorial Scholarship is to reward an active Kosciusko County 4-H member in the Swine project for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in our 4-H Swine project by awarding a scholarship for further agricultural study at an accredited college, university, or trade/technical school.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

The Kosciusko County 4-H Scholarship program is to reward active 4-H members for outstanding achievement, service, leadership, and citizenship in the 4-H by awarding scholarship to them for a further study at an accredited college, university, trade or technical school.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H POULTRY COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established to recognize those 4-H members who have contributed to the success of the Poultry project at the Kosciusko County 4-H fair.

KOSCIUSKO COUNTY 4-H RABBIT COMMITTEE SCHOLARSHIP

This scholarship was established to recognize those students who have contributed to the success of the Rabbit project at the Kosciusko County 4-H fair.

Applicant or immediate family must be current paid members of the Kosciusko County Cattlemen's Association in the year of application and for a minimum of 2 years. Tom Smith and Rudy Ross Memorial Scholarships	Minimum 6 years in sheep project, currently enrolled in sheep. Evaluated by attitude, active participation in local 4-H club, and county 4-H program. Number determined by selection committee.	Recipients will receive \$100 after a paid receipt of the semester/books is received at the Extension Office.	Kosciusko County 4-H Sheep Committee
Gene Milner Memorial Scholarship	Must be a 10-year 4-H member & participated in the Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports project for the past two years. Evaluation based on level of participation in the Shooting Sports project, in other 4-H programs, attitude, and in other youth & community programs. Number determined by selection committee.	Paid after one semester/term upon presentation of a school transcript to the Extension Office.	Kosciusko County 4-H Shooting Sports Committee
Jay Haab Memorial Scholarship	Last year of 4-H eligibility with a minimum of 3 years of participation in the 4-H Swine project. Applicant must intend to pursue an agricultural degree. One scholarship awarded annually.	Awarded to the recipient upon presentation of a paid school fees statement to the Extension Office.	Kosciusko County 4-H Swine Committee
Kosciusko County 4- H Council	Last year of 4-H eligibility with a minimum of 7 years of completed participation. 5 scholarships awarded annually.	Awarded in one payment of \$500 following the fall semester/term.	Kosciusko County 4-H Council Awards Committee
Kosciusko County 4- H Poultry Committee	Last year of 4-H eligibility with a minimum of 5 years of completed 4-H and a graduate of a high school serving Kosciusko County (or earned a GED equivalent or home schooled). 2- \$200 scholarships will be given each year. You must exhibit a willingness to assist other Poultry exhibitors by helping them care for, learn about, and present their Poultry projects in a positive manner. Payment will be made directly to the school of your choice and credited to your account.	Payment will be made directly to the school attending and credited to your account. GENERAL RULES

- 1. Applicants must be properly enrolled in the Indiana 4-H Program in Kosciusko County and in good standing.
- 2. All applications must include a current school or college transcript and a headshot photo.
- 3. All applications must include an adult assessment/reference (pastor, 4-H leader, teacher); however, this letter cannot be from a family member.
- 4. For scholarship, applicant must intend to pursue study at an accredited college, university, vocational, trade or technical school.
- 5. Applicants must exhibit initiative, commitment, and positive attitude toward education. These character traits will be determined from the application.
- 6. A completed application must be submitted by the due date of the current year to the 4-H Youth Development Educator for Purdue Extension-Kosciusko County.
- 7. All scholarship monies should be used for tuition, room & board, books or other school academic fees.
- 8. Scholarship recipients must complete the current year of 4-H enrollment to receive the award monies.
- 9. Scholarships must be used within two years of receiving the award. If not used they will be forfeited.
- 10. If for any reason a scholarship recipient does not remain in school, the scholarship will be forfeited. The recipient must notify the 4-H Youth Development Educator for Kosciusko County immediately.
- 11. You may attach a maximum of three additional attached pages for six pages for the scholarship application.
- 12. All qualified applicants will have an equal opportunity to compete for scholarship and awards regardless of their race, color, sex, religion, national origin, age, or handicap.
