Hoosier Hampshire Swine Breeders Association, Inc. Junior Scholarship Program Due: June 30, 2024

Up to 5 scholarships in the amount of \$1,000.00 each but no more than half the applicants will be awarded every year to junior swine exhibitors (unless there is not a qualified applicant) which have shown a Hampshire pig at least 5 years at the Indiana State Fair during their 4-H or FFA career and who wish to continue their education after graduation from High School. Applicants must be of good character and in good standing with the Hoosier Hampshire Swine Association and the 4-H/FFA Organizations.

Guidelines:

- 1. Scholarship applications can be made for any type of college, junior college, short course or trade schools
- 2. Non-agriculture majors will be considered along with agriculture majors, although more emphasis may be placed on those individuals seeking higher education in an agricultural curriculum.
- 3. Scholarship awards will not be made on basis of gender. In any given year, both scholarships may or may not be awarded to candidates of the same sex.
- 4. Candidates do not necessarily have to be sons or daughters of the National or Hoosier Hampshire Swine Breeders Association, although more emphasis will likely be placed on those family members during the selection process.
- 5. Candidates may make application during their senior year of high school or during their freshman, sophomore, or junior years of college.
- 6. The Hoosier Hampshire Swine Scholarship can be awarded to any of individual only once.
- 7. Candidates will be evaluated and scholarships awarded on the following basis:
 - a. Activity in the Hoosier Hampshire Swine Association.
 - b. Involvement in Junior Swine activities: 4-H & FFA
 - c. Community activities and involvement
 - d. Future Plans
 - e. Personal interview with selection and evaluation committee if necessary, at the discretion of the selection committee
- 8. Selection will be made by a committee of up to five people including:
 - a. Scholarship Committee Chairperson (or their designee)
 - b. Hoosier Hampshire Swine Breeder's officer (or their designee)
 - c. 4-H Youth Educator or Vo-Ag Teacher
 - d. Pork Producer
 - e. Pork Council Women member
