## MAY 15TH IS THE FINAL DEADLINE FOR ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION & REQUIRED PAPERWORK!

One of the most critical 4-H deadlines of the year is fast approaching—Wednesday, May 15th. This is the absolute final day for all 4-H members to:

- Complete Animal ID in 4HOnline
- · Add or drop projects in 4HOnline
- Submit any required paperwork for livestock projects

Animals NOT entered in 4HOnline by May 15 will NOT be eligible to exhibit at the County or State Fair no exceptions. This policy is non-negotiable. To avoid disappointment, we strongly recommend entering all animals you might show. You can always decide not to exhibit later—but you cannot add animals after May 15.

#### Enrollment Letters & Paperwork

Hardcopy enrollment letters (with any required paperwork for your species) will be mailed to you soon. We sincerely apologize for the delay—our office is currently running a bit behind, and we appreciate your patience.

Please keep in mind that it typically takes 5 business days for mail to travel from our doors to yours, so plan accordingly. If you have questions or aren't sure what paperwork applies to your projects, please don't wait reach out and we'll help you sort it out!

Also, not all livestock projects have additional paperwork—your enrollment letter will clearly outline what (if anything) needs to be submitted.

#### Required by May 15:

- ✓ Animal Identification in 4HOnline for all species
- DNA Hair Samples for beef, swine, sheep, meat goats, and dairy feeders
- ✓ Animal Lease Forms if applicable
- ✓ Paper enrollment forms for Cats, Pocket Caged Critters, and Poultry
- ✓ Vaccination Forms for Cats, Ferrets, and Horse & Pony

If you're not sure what applies to your animals or projects, please reach out—we're here to help!

- Double check your entries
- Return required paperwork on time
- Ask questions early—don't wait!

- Stay organized and don't wait until the last minute—if you have any questions, we're just a phone call away at 574-372-2340!

We don't like being the bad guys, but we also don't want anyone to be surprised. Deadlines in 4-H are very real and very final—and missing them has consequences. Here's a reminder of what happens if things aren't completed on time:

- May 15 Animal ID & Paperwork Deadline
- Animals NOT entered in 4HOnline by May 15 will NOT be allowed to exhibit at the County or State Fair.
- No exceptions. Even if you have the animal, if it's not in the system, it can't show.
- June 15 QLC/YQCA Certification Deadline
  - Members who have not completed QLC or YQCA by June 15 will NOT be allowed to show at the County or State Fair.
  - No certification = no livestock show.
- June 15 FairEntry Deadline
  - Animal Projects: If your animal is not entered in FairEntry by this date, it will be shown in an Exhibition Class only (not eligible for placing or awards).
  - General Projects: If your project is not entered in FairEntry by this date, it cannot place higher than a Blue Ribbon, and it cannot advance to the Indiana State Fair.

# ANIMAL IDENTIFICATION-DUE MAY 15, 2025

ALL animals must be properly identified in 4HOnline by May 15, 2025. This is non-negotiable—any animal not entered by the deadline is NOT eligible to show at the 4-H County or State Fair.

We strongly encourage families to enter ALL animals, even if you're unsure whether you'll show them. It's always better to have them in the system just in case.

Poultry – Paper Enrollment Form Required

Just a reminder—ALL poultry members must turn in the Poultry Paper Enrollment Form to the Extension Office by May 15, in addition to entering their birds in 4HOnline.

This process began in 2024 and continues this year—both steps are required.

  If you are NOT taking your swine to the 2025 Indiana State Fair, you do NOT need an RFID tag.
- In the RFID field in 4HOnline, enter 16 zeros (00000000000000) to complete your animal ID.

# 2025 4-H ROYALTY CONTEST

FairEntry is REQUIRED for all 4-H members and, new for 2025, Mini 4-H members too! It's how you officially sign up for which projects and animals you're bringing to the 4-H Fair.

FairEntry is open May 22 – June 15, 2025 If you do not enter your projects by June 15, you risk losing eligibility for awards, competition classes, and State Fair advancement (see consequences section!).

## What is FairEntry?

FairEntry is the second step after 4HOnline enrollment. While 4HOnline tells us what projects you're enrolled in, FairEntry tells us exactly what you're bringing to the fair—which animals, which posters, which crafts, etc. It also lets us print entry tags, stall cards, and judges' sheets—so if it's not in FairEntry, it's like it doesn't exist.

NEW for 2025 – Mini 4-H FairEntry Mini 4-H members will now also need to complete FairEntry.

This helps us plan space, assign judging times, and celebrate your Mini accomplishments too!

# EAST GATE ENTRANCE POLICY: STRICTER ENFORCEMENT FOR FAIR WEEK

The Fair Board is tightening security at the East Gate this year to ensure a smoother and safer entrance process. Moving forward, all vehicles using the East Gate must have a valid hang tag displayed, and every person inside the vehicle must be wearing the appropriate wristband.

#### What You Need to Know:

- ✓ Hang Tags Required No vehicle will be permitted through the East Gate without a properly displayed hang tag.
- ✓ Wristbands for All Every passenger must have their wristband on before arriving at the gate.
- ✓ Be Prepared to Stop Gate attendants will be checking each vehicle. Have your hang tag and wristbands ready to avoid delays.
- ✓ Exit Only from 11 PM to 5 AM No entry will be allowed during these hours; the gate will function as an exit only.
- ✓ Horse Barn Walk-Through Gate Security will be stationed at the East entrance walk-through gate by the horse barn from 9 AM to 10 PM to check for wristbands or tickets.
- ✓ Badge Option Available If anyone has an issue with wearing a wristband, they may request a badge from the Fairgrounds Office located near the Grandstands.

Anyone without the required credentials will be turned away and directed to use the main entrance. These policies are in place to maintain security and ensure that only authorized individuals access the fairgrounds through this entrance.

Please plan ahead and follow these guidelines to help keep fair operations running smoothly!

# PREMISE ID REQUIRED FOR LIVESTOCK EXHIBITORS

Anyone who buys, sells, or exhibits livestock is required to have a Premise ID, which is an identification number for the physical location where animals are housed. This is essential for protecting animal agriculture and the livestock industry.

All 4-H members must know the Premise ID for the property where their animals are kept, and it must be entered into 4HOnline when enrolling animals for the 4-H Fair and Indiana State Fair. The BOAH staff asks that you not wait until the last minute to request your Premise ID. While they do their best to accommodate everyone, they experience a high volume of calls and emails, and they cannot guarantee instant processing.

You must have a premise ID to show at the Kosciusko County 4-H Fair and the Indiana State Fair for Cattle, Swine, Goats and Sheep.

# **QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE (QLC)**REMINDER

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program

All 4-H members planning to exhibit beef, dairy, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry, or rabbits at the County or State Fair must complete Quality Livestock Care (QLC) or YQCA by June 15, 2025.

QLC is an in-person training approved by the Indiana 4-H Program as an alternative to YQCA. It focuses on animal well-being, good production practices, and responsible care—key skills for every livestock exhibitor.

### Important Details:

- ✓ Deadline: June 15 (This Year Only!) No exceptions! All volunteer enrollments must be completed by this date.
- ✓ Future Deadline: March 15 Starting next year, the deadline will move to March 15 in accordance with Purdue guidelines. Volunteers must be fully enrolled and approved before interacting with 4-H members.
- ✓ Free Wristbands Only those on the submitted list will receive a free wristband.
- No Late Additions Once the list is turned in to the Fair Office, no names will be added. Volunteers who miss the deadline will need to purchase their own wristband.
- Committee & Council Volunteers Those serving on committees or councils should not be voting on business unless they are approved, screened volunteers.

Wristbands are required for entry at the East Gate, so don't wait—get your enrollment completed today to avoid any issues!

# **\*\*POSTER EXHIBIT REQUIREMENTS**

Read Carefully!

All 4-H members entering poster projects must follow these guidelines. Failure to follow instructions may result in a lower exhibit grade.

#### ✓ Poster Guidelines:

- Size: Posters must be 22" x 28" unless stated otherwise in your project manual. Posters do not have to be white.
- Labels: A 3" x 5.5" label will be provided by the 4-H Office during project check-in to include your name, project, and level. Please plan your layout so the label can be attached in the lower right-hand corner.
- Backing: Posters must have a stiff backing to prevent curling. Acceptable materials include:
  - Foam core board
  - Very stiff cardboard
  - Plywood or Masonite (at least 1/8" thick)
- Plastic Covering: Use a clear plastic sleeve to protect your poster. These are available at the Extension Office for \$0.25 each. Please do not use kitchen wrap!
- Citations: Be sure to cite all sources used especially for educational posters.
- Club Info: Write your name and 4-H club clearly on the back of your poster.
- Orientation: Posters should be displayed horizontally—think dollar bill layout.


