

## RETURNING ADULT VOLUNTEERS

Please be sure to select ALL of your roles in Lake County 4-H. If you forget something, we will have to send it back to you for corrections. This will delay your enrollment process.

Typical Lake County 4-H Volunteer Roles:

### Club Volunteer: Club Organizational Leader

- Work directly with youth in a 4-H club setting

Includes “community” clubs like Brunswick Beavers, Crown Clovers, etc. (members in grades K-12, monthly meetings). Also Junior Leaders and Color Guard & Drill Team. These clubs all have charters/EINs, file annually with IRS, and may have treasuries.

### Club Volunteer: Affiliate Member

- Serve on County Committee Board
- Interested in possibly serving on County Committee Board in 2025

### Club Volunteer: Unit Volunteer

- Work with youth in Juntos 4-H
- Work with youth in 4-H Discovery

### Program Volunteer: General Program Volunteer

- Choose this if your 4-H role does not fit anywhere else (check with Educator). Examples: chaperoning state/national trips or working in 4-H Building during the Fair but not connected with a particular project.

### Program Volunteer: Spark Club Volunteer

- Lead or help lead the Garden Spark Club at Gary Community Partnership

### Project Volunteer: Subject Matter/Project Leader

- Serve as project superintendent or assistant superintendent
- Help youth with 4-H project work at workshops or at the Fair
- Coach or help coach a judging team
- Serve on Auction Committee
- Serve on Horse & Pony Committee
