Scholarship Opportunities

The Rabbit Committee offers a \$250 scholarship to graduating senior Rabbit Project participants. Application may be found here: bit.ly/20214HRabbitScholarship

What are the requirements?

- Must have completed 6 years in the Rabbit Project
- Must complete an essay
- Must fill out application and turned in at Rabbit Check-in
- Applications must be typed
- Must be continuing their education in a technical school, trade school, college, or university
- If awarded, must be used during the first year of post high school education

How are winners selected?

- 25% participation in Rabbit program
- 25% Leadership abilities/citizenship
- 25% Essay (used to break a tie)
- 25% Need

Once selected, how will I receive the scholarship?

After proof of successful completion of the first semester is provided to the Purdue Extension—LaPorte County office, the award money will be provided directly to the participant.

Entry Details

4HOnline: Rabbits must be owned and cared for by 4-H members, and only shown by the exhibitor, from May 15th through to fair. You must ID your animals in 4HOnline by May 15th.

Tattooing Sessions: All rabbits exhibited must have a tattoo in the rabbit's left ear. There is a \$1.00 charge per rabbit at select workshops. Tattooing will not take place during fair. Note: The Committee cannot be held responsible for injury or death of rabbit as a result of tattooing.

Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Requirements: Each 4-H member who is participating in Beef or Dairy Feeder, Sheep, Goat, Swine, Poultry

and Rabbits projects will need to complete the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care Program. These trainings will all be held in-person for the upcoming year. Register for a session through 4HOnline, under events. The cost is \$3. You may still complete YQCA online however, you must send a copy of your completion certificate to 4-H staff at woznia11@purdue.edu.

FairEntry: All rabbits that are to be shown at fair exhibition will need to be entered into FairEntry by the June deadline date.



Fair Details

Pen reservations: \$10.00 per member are to be turned in to Rabbit Committee Treasurer, no later than June 15th. No exceptions to the deadline. Substitutions at entry time only in same class.

- Printed reservation form must be complete with sex, color, age, and ear numbers (no blank ear numbers)
- Confirm your rabbit is sexed correctly. If it is entered into the wrong class, it will not be shown.
- You can scratch a rabbit due to illness, death, molt, etc. or if you
 chose to not bring it for whatever reason. You can substitute
 rabbits if they are in the same class (breed, sex, age, and color) as
 the original rabbit. If rabbits are tattooed just before fair, the ink
 must be removed in order for the numbers to be read.

Fair Set-up/tear-down: Families that volunteer to help with the setup and tear-down of the rabbit barn, help support the Rabbit Committee and the youth involved in the project.

Fair Concession/Food Stand: Members working shifts in the food stand financially supports the 4-H Rabbit program.

• Each year, the food stand buys rabbits from members, creating a market for our members to sell their rabbits. We will buy all breeds at \$1.00 per pound live weight.

The more food stand shifts that a 4-H member works, the more opportunity they will have to earn more money in the auction. If you wish to sell rabbits, contact Jody Rose at 219-608-4372 or Nancy Williamson at 219-369-9314.

- We need help deboning the rabbits. These steps are very easy to learn and If everyone would offer to help, it would lighten the load for all. Our theory is, "come when you can and leave when you have to."
- Any one that helps with deboning will be compensated with "Bunny Bucks" that can be redeemed at the food stand during fair.
 The more that you work the more you earn for auction, if you are selling in auction.
- Processing dates will be announced at the workshops.

Fair Check In: Upon arrival to fair you will be given entry cards. This is the time to confirm they are correct and match your pen reservation.

 Nails should always be trimmed before check in to avoid excess scratches to the volunteers.
