4-H VOLUNTEER ANNOUNCEMENTS

If you are meeting and you are not enrolled you are not covered under our insurance and you are not in compliance with the our 4-H Policies. We appreciate you wanting to volunteer but until you enroll you cannot host club meetings, vote, or actively participate in activities.

Remember in order to receive fair passes, you will need to log 6 hours of professional development and/or youth programming opportunities. This does not have to be difficult or complicated, many of you are already doing this. Council and Committee meetings will count for 1 hour of professional development. Club meetings and workshops count for youth programing hours. We are not super stringent on what can count we just want you to be out there interacting with the awesome youth in the program. In order to log your hours, we need sign in sheets from club meetings or workshops. Committees, we need the minutes with those that attended listed within 2 weeks, sign in sheets are good but we need minutes anyway so we will save a step if you just send minutes.

MANUALS

Indiana 4-H and Purdue Extension has made the decision that they will no longer require the use of manuals for 4-H projects and will not carry any manuals in the Ed Store. It is the decision of LaPorte County that we will phase out carrying the manuals as well, as they no longer match with project guidelines. Manuals can still be found at the Shop 4-H store. The office has a small inventory of misc. manuals and once those are gone, they are gone.

RECORD SHEETS

Working with the 4-H Council, the Educators have decided this year there will be a general record sheet for most of the projects that are offered in LaPorte County. The record sheet will be turned in at the members' first project check-in and will be returned in their ribbon packets after the fair exhibition. Here is a list of projects that will still need to complete an additional project record sheet: American Heritage, Cat, Collections, Container Gardening, Dog, Horse & Pony, Horseless Horse, Poultry, Rabbit, and Small Animals. The record sheet is different than skill sheets. If you need help or need to know the difference do not hesitate to reach out.


