VOLUNTEERS, it is important that you get enrolled. If you are meeting and you are not enrolled you are not covered under our insurance and you are not in compliance with the our 4-H Policies. We appreciate you wanting to volunteer but until you enroll you cannot host club meetings, vote, or actively participate in activities.

Remember in order to receive fair passes, you will need to log 6 hours of professional development and/or youth programming opportunities. This does not have to be difficult or complicated, many of you are already doing this. Council and Committee meetings will count for 1 hour of professional development. Club meetings and workshops count for youth programing hours. We are not super stringent on what can count we just want you to be out there interacting with the awesome youth in the program. In order to log your hours, we need sign in sheets from club meetings or workshops. Committees, we need the minutes with those that attended listed within 2 weeks, sign in sheets are good but we need minutes anyway so we will save a step if you just send minutes.

Interested Indiana 4-H or FFA students will attend a training workshop February 24 or March 16 at one of six locations throughout Indiana.

This workshop is a prerequisite to Indiana 4-H and FFA students competing in a contest hosted at the Bane-Welker Equipment training center June 8. This competitive event is designed to test student's skills as they are given a scenario and a specified amount of time to diagnose an electrical system issue and write up a work order. Students may compete individually or as a team of two.

4-H (onsumer)) ecision Making

This year's state 4-H Consumer Decision Making contest will be held on April 6, 2024 at Purdue University in Stone Hall. On our website you will find the registration link, the 2024 Study Guide and other study guides/resources to prepare your teams. We will be using scantron this year. Registration will close on March 29, 2024.

Who: This contest is for 4-H youth in grades 9-12. A coach can be a 4-H educator or an Approved 4-H Volunteer. Teams can be made up of 3-4, 4-H youth and individuals welcome. We want to welcome any high-school age youth who wishes to participate and join 4-H. Questions about 4-H membership, should be directed to their local county Extension Office.

Kitchen Skillathon

The 2024 Kitchen Skillathon will be hosted as an Exhibition contest. This will be a year to showcase the Skillathon, allow youth to participate in a stress free environment, and collect feedback from participants, coaches and educators. The feedback will be used to improve the Skillathon for its inaugural kick off in 2024! This will be held the same day (April 6th), time (9:30), and location as Consumer Decision Making (Purdue- Stone Hall).

Kitchen Skillathon is an educational opportunity for 4-H members to demonstrate increased knowledge and competence with common kitchen equipment, small appliances, herbs/spices, and hazards/safety in the kitchen. Teams will be made up of 3-4 youth in grades 6-8. The contest will consist of four identification stations including small appliances, kitchen equipment/tools, herbs/spices, and kitchen hazards/safety; a written test and a skills demonstration. For the Skills Demonstration, participants can practice, and receive feedback from a judge, on an assigned kitchen/cooking type skill. Participants will complete the skill while at the judging table. All materials will be provided however youth will need to select all items needed to demonstrate the skill assigned to them.


