FOR YOU TO EXPLAIN IF YOU ARE ASKED

The mission of the Marshall County Extension Homemakers is to strengthen families through continuing education, leadership, development for volunteer community service. Extension Homemaker clubs generally consist of 5 or more members who plan and conduct an annual program of educational meetings and activities. Clubs have officers and, as necessary, committees. Extension Homemaker clubs provide opportunities for members to participate in a group, speak up and express an opinion, learn and practice the principles of parliamentary procedure, and serve as officers and on committees.

In addition, they provide opportunities for members to learn about specific topics in:

Cultural arts and textiles Family economics and home business management International homemaking Health, nutrition and safety Resource management Personal and family development

The Extension Homemaker program is open to anyone. Mary Ellen Howkinson Scholarship

The Mary Ellen Howkinson Scholarship fund was established to honor Mary Ellen Howkinson, Marshall County Home Economist from 1964 through 1981. It is offered to one recipient each year. Scholarships go out near the beginning of March and are generally due by late April

2023 Scholarship recipient was Anne Blake, daughter of Carol Blake, an Extension Homemaker member.

Article IX – Amendments

The constitutions or by-laws may be amended at any council meeting by a two thirds vote of the members present, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing at one meeting previous to the voting meeting.

By-Laws

The council shall buy the incoming county president a pin for the year in which he/she begins to serve. This pin is to be bought by the

treasurer. The pin will be presented at Achievement Night.

The council shall pay all expenses accrued in giving leader training programs.

 \bar{L} ocal clubs shall hold elections and submit the names of officers for the ensuing year to the Extension Office no later than May 1.

OPEN CLASS REPRESENTITIVE: Each club will be required to have two (2) members be present in the Open Class Building for a two (2) hour period during fair week.

The council shall pay registration and lodging to Home & Family Conference for incoming officers and outgoing president.

Dues

1. County dues are \$4.00 per member.

2. State Association dues are \$5.00 per member.

3. Annual state and county dues for members are payable between April 15 and May 15 to Extension Homemaker County Treasurer, *Becky Hartman*. (This means that the local clubs will need to collect dues from members in April).

4. New clubs formed and new members that join between July 1 and December 31 are required to pay their full county and state dues of \$9. Clubs formed and members who join after December 31 will be required to pay $\frac{1}{2}$ of their county dues, \$2 total. (No state dues after December 31.)

5. International Coins for Friendship Fund (voluntary contributions). This fund provides monies for Women Feed the World, Ruth B. Sayre Scholarship, donations to ACWW and CWC. It also pays IEHA dues to ACWW and CWC.

It is divided:

- 50% general

Section 6 - The association officers shall be elected at the April Council Meeting and installed at Achievement Night.

Article VI

Section 1 - The president shall preside at all meetings of the county association and at executive board meetings. The president shall appoint all committees, not otherwise provided for, and perform such other duties as usually devolve upon such officers.
 Section 2 - The vice president shall preside at meetings in the absence of the president. The vice president shall be chairman of the

committee in charge of program planning and the program books. **Section 3** - The vice president shall assume duties of the president the following year.

Section 4 - The secretary shall keep the roll of the clubs. The secretary shall keep accurate records and accounts of the business of the association and the executive board. The secretary shall also report accounts of all meetings and activities to the press.
 Section 5 - The treasurer shall be in charge of all funds of the association and pay all bills allowed by the council. The treasurer shall surrender all audited books and accounts at the end of the year.
 Section 6 - Retiring officers shall surrender all important papers and accounts to their successors at the officers training meeting for all newly elected officers.

Article VII – Council

Section 1 - The association officers and the presidents of the various Extension Homemakers clubs shall constitute the Marshall County Extension Homemakers Council. The retiring county president, extension educator and/or Extension Homemaker Assistant shall serve in an advisory capacity.

Section 2 - Meetings of the Council and executive board shall be called by the president.

Section 3 - A quorum shall consist of at least three association officers and two-thirds of all local presidents.

Articles VIII – Committees

Section 1 - Standing committees shall consist of Auditing, Budget, Nominating, Program Books, and Program Planning to be appointed by the president in time that the names shall appear in the program book for the ensuing year. Such other committees shall be appointed by the president.

Section 2 - Each of the above committees shall be for a 1 year term. **Section 3** - County Committee Chairs should attend the executive board meetings when business pertains to the function of their responsibility.

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS Marshall County Extension Homemaker Association

Article I – Name

The name of this organization shall be the Marshall County Extension Homemaker Association.

Article II – Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to promote the educational, social, and general welfare of the county, in cooperation with the County Extension Service.

Article III – Membership

Any local Extension Homemakers club in Marshall County may associate with the Marshall County Extension Homemaker Association by paying county dues. All clubs shall also cooperate in the program as outlined by the Extension Homemaker Council and the Indiana Cooperative Extension Service.

H.O.M.E. Membership is available to individuals who cannot participate in the traditional club structure. By paying H.O.M.E. dues, members will be affiliated with the Marshall County Extension Homemaker Association.

All Membership shall be open to all people regardless of color, race, sex, religion, national origin, age or handicap.

Article IV

- Section 1 The affiliated clubs shall pay annual dues of \$9.00 per club member and \$7.00 (\$5.00 State/ \$2.00 County) for H.O.M.E. members.
- **Section 2** The Council shall have the power to change the amount of the county dues as the need may arise.
- **Section 3** All dues shall be paid to the association treasurer by May 15 of each year.
- **Section 4** If dues are not paid by June 1, club will be deleted from list.

Article V

Section 1 - The officers of the association shall be president, vice president, secretary and treasurer. These officers shall constitute the executive board. The county extension educator and immediate past president shall serve on this board in an advisory capacity.

Section 2 - The term of office shall be one year, or until a successor is elected.

- **Section 3** The association president and vice president, at the time of election, shall be a president or past president of a local club. The secretary and treasurer may be any club member so elected.
- Section 4 Two persons from the same club may serve at the same time when there is no one else available to fill an office.

Section 5 - Any vacancy which may occur during the term of office shall be filled by a person appointed by the executive board.

HISTORY OF INDIANA EXTENSION HOMEMAKERS

During the period of 1910 to 1919, Purdue University gave leadership to organize home economics extension in Indiana. Families were contacted through Farmers Institutes. Women's auxiliaries grew out of this movement and from this, the home economics club developed. Leaders in the counties initiated classes for farm women. In 1910 there were 10 classes.

These groups later become known as home economics clubs and finally as home demonstration clubs.

In 1913 the women leaders from various counties in attendance at a conference at Purdue University voted to organize a State Home Economics Association for the purpose of encouraging more co-education groups for homemakers and to promote the teaching of "domestic science" in the local schools.

By 1927 a total of 389 extension clubs with a total of 10,142 members were established. The Indiana Extension Service is the largest organized program of its kind in the nation.

ORGANIZATIONAL STRUCTURE OF INDIANA HOMEMAKERS CLUBS

11,969 Members belong to 993 Local Extension Homemakers Clubs represented by County Extension Homemakers Councils in Districts which includes the Michigan City District which is made up from Elkhart, Kosciusko, Lake, LaPorte, Marshall, Porter, Starke, and St. Joseph which make up the Indiana Extension Homemakers Association (IEHA) which joins other states in the National Volunteer Outreach Network (NVON) with membership in the Associated Country Women of the World (ACWW) and CWC Country Women's Council).
