- ~Program Planning Process. It was decided that more information is needed about this. Michelle said she would look into it for us.
- ~YQCA will now be called "Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care".
- -Michelle had a Webinar about the changes,

- -This year each member will be required to do in-person training only. There will not be any online classes offered
- -Cost is \$3 per child
- -The question of who is qualified to teach the classes was asked. As it is understood right now, only Michelle will be able to teach these classes. FFA Advisors/teachers will no longer be able to help teach them. Michelle has asked for back-up and hasn't gotten a reply back yet
- -It was brought up that last year we had the Youth Educator and several FFA Advisors available to help get the classes done and we still had many who had to do the online option.
- -The question of what species are required to take these classes was asked. Last year Horse & Pony, Dogs, and Cats no longer were required to take them. They are non-marketable animals and only marketable animals were required. Michelle said she will check on this, too.

MARSHALL COUNTY TROPHY MEETING December 1, 2022 Tonja Lemler, Council Secretary

- -Members of the Marshall County Council, Fairboard, and Livestock Committees met at 6pm before the regularly scheduled December Council meeting to discuss the trophy/banners/plaques for the 2023 year Fair.
- -There was much discussion on what each livestock species would prefer to have and the basic consensus was that most of them would prefer a banner over a trophy or a plaque.
- -Exhibit Hall, Dogs, Cats, and Horse & Pony all would prefer to keep the trophies.
- -No matter what is chosen, the price point is \$20 for Reserve and \$25 for Grand. These prices will stay the same no matter if it is a banner, plaque, or trophy.
- -The Awards Committee will choose and decide on the style and sizes. Council will have the final vote.
- -Barb Penrod and Patti Kitch presented us with several picture samples, sizes, and price options from a few different places.
- -Tic Toc Trophy Shop, Schafer Trophy, and 1st Place Trophy are the places we are looking at. Tic Toc Trophy and First Place Trophy will be presenting their options in person and be given 30 min each. They will need to be notified of the time and place of the meeting. Barb Penrod agreed to send all of the information to Lindsay and/or Michelle.
- -Jeremy and others said that they can only offer banners in the \$30-40 price points. One place was quoting as low as \$9.50, but Barb wasn't able to see a sample from them yet.
- -The question of what process they use to print the banners was mentioned. Some asked what type of material they would be using; paper, vinyl, material, etc..
- -What everyone would like to see on a banner was discussed. Colors, wording, fonts, sizes, and design ideas were topics of discussion.
- -The vendors are going to be asked to bring along several examples of "mock samples" of what we could get for our county. We would be able to compare the quality of banners and their work this way, too.

- -Styles of banners and the use of grommets or dowel rods as options were mentioned.
- -We are focusing on two sizes. One for Grand and one for Reserve Grand. Grand possibly measuring 24x30 and Reserve 12x18.
- -It was mentioned that the office will need to notify our vendors of our meeting day and time.
- -We agreed the next trophy meeting will be before the next regularly scheduled Council meeting on January 5th, 2023. The meetings will go as follows:
