The Dairy Youth Academy is for youth in grades 10-12 (as of September 1, 2024) who are interested in pursuing a career in the dairy industry.

The program consists of a series of hands-on workshops that focus on specific facets of the dairy industry, including veterinary science, dairy nutrition, and production management.

The Dairy Youth Academy exposes participants to progressive and profitable agricultural businesses and helps prepare them for employment as managers, technicians, and other agri-service professionals.



Objectives of the Academy:

Eligibility Requirements:

1. To be eligible to participate in the academy You must be in grades 10-12 by September 1, 2024.
1. Be currently enrolled in the 4-H program.
2. Are able to reasonably commit to the Dairy Youth Academy from September of the current year to August of the following year .
3. Are not exhibiting dairy animals at the World Dairy Expo during the current year.

To be eligible to participate in the academy The top 14 delegates will be selected based on their leadership and written application by a panel of industry and extension representatives. Upon acceptance in the Academy, delegates must pay a fee of \$250. Most expenses will be generously covered by our sponsors.

Each delegate will be required to evaluate how dairy industry conferences and agricultural tours have enhanced the development of their career opportunities in the dairy industry. These reports will be compiled and delivered in an oral presentation to the local groups and affiliates.
