

Hello Bobbie! My name is Joni and I am the Community Relations Coordinator for A Senior Retreat.


I wanted to send a quick email to say thank you, and thank you to the Morgan County Extension Homemakers, for the fidget bean bags!

- 1. All baking must be entered on white paper plates or heavy cardboard.
- 2. A copy of the recipe or list of ingredients must be included with the entry.
- Baking may be covered with wax paper. Avoid the use of plastic or foil wrap due to a possible change in texture.
- 4. All baking items must have been made by the exhibitor.
- 5. Limit one entry per person per section.
- 6. No cream filled products will be accepted.
- Prizes to be awarded include one blue, one red, and one white ribbon for each section at the judge's discretion. Premiums will be given as described in the General Rules.
- One Champion ribbon and two Reserve Champion ribbons will be awarded in this department.

Apple tip:

How do I keep apples from turning brown?

-As the flesh of a peeled apple is exposed to air, it will begin to brown. This doesn't really matter if you're baking the apples in a recipe, but if you prefer to keep the apple flesh its original pale color, fill a large bowl with water and squeeze the juice of a lemon into the water. Keep the peeled or cut apples submerged in the water until needed. The acid content of the water will prevent browning.

Morgan County Extension Homemakers Council Meeting - 06/04/2025

The Council met at the Auditorium, 4-H Building at 10:00am. Those attending were President Denise Walker, Treasurer Tura LaMar, Secretary Diann Vanzant, Past President Cindy Saferight, Education/Scholarships/ Grant Chair Helen Smith, Supply Purchaser Sue Tutewiler and 4H Council Representative Amy Runkel. Clubs were represented: Amici President Tura LaMar, Friendly Neighbors President Diann Vanzant, Monrovia President Denise Walker.

The meeting was opened by President Denise Walker followed by leading the Pledge of Allegiance, The Homemakers Creed, IEHA Mission Statement. Devotions were read by Denise with a "Patience" theme. The roll call was taken by Secretary Diann with 7 Council Members present. Secretary Diann did not read the April Minutes and there was no May meeting due to no one being able to attend. A motion was made to not read the minutes for April by Helen and seconded by Tura. The Treasurer's Report dated 5/31/2025 was read by Treasurer Tura. After the meeting a corrected copy was sent out by Amy. An ending balance of \$2,771.97 was reported in the General Fund. A motion was made to accept the report by Sue. It was seconded by Helen.

OLD BUSINESS

The Red Manual still needs updating. Several items need job Descriptions: Teacher Grant, PR, Moneymaking Project and Historian.

NEW BUSINESS

Several items involving the Morgan County Fair were discussed. When your club is serving in the Home and Family Arts Building, make sure 4 members of your Club are there. This will be the President's responsibility. Tura volunteered to make up some new Do Not Touch signs for the quilts. Kathy Hazel has volunteered to serve as our new Garden Superintendent. People helping with Baker's Best need to be there by 10:00 am to help set up. After some discussion it was decided the Raffle Tickets will be \$5.00 each this year.

Diann announced a money-making opportunity. We have been asked to serve an evening meal on July 21st at 6:00 in the Auditorium, 4-H Building for approximately 40 people. After discussion it was decided we would be able to do it. We will be paid \$300 from Farm Bureau Inc. and \$200 from the Beef Producers.

Our next meeting will be in the Home and Family Arts Building at 4:00, July 2nd. Since we do not have a President or Vice President currently, we need everyone to come and discus the needs of our County. Bring some ideas that you would like to do and let's get things going again. The Council hopes everyone can attend this important meeting!

Avoid these five common summer-related accidents and illnesses.



Use a sunscreen with an SPF of 30+ and reapply every two hours

dehydration

Drink plenty of water and avoid sugary, caffeinated and alcoholic drinks

burns
