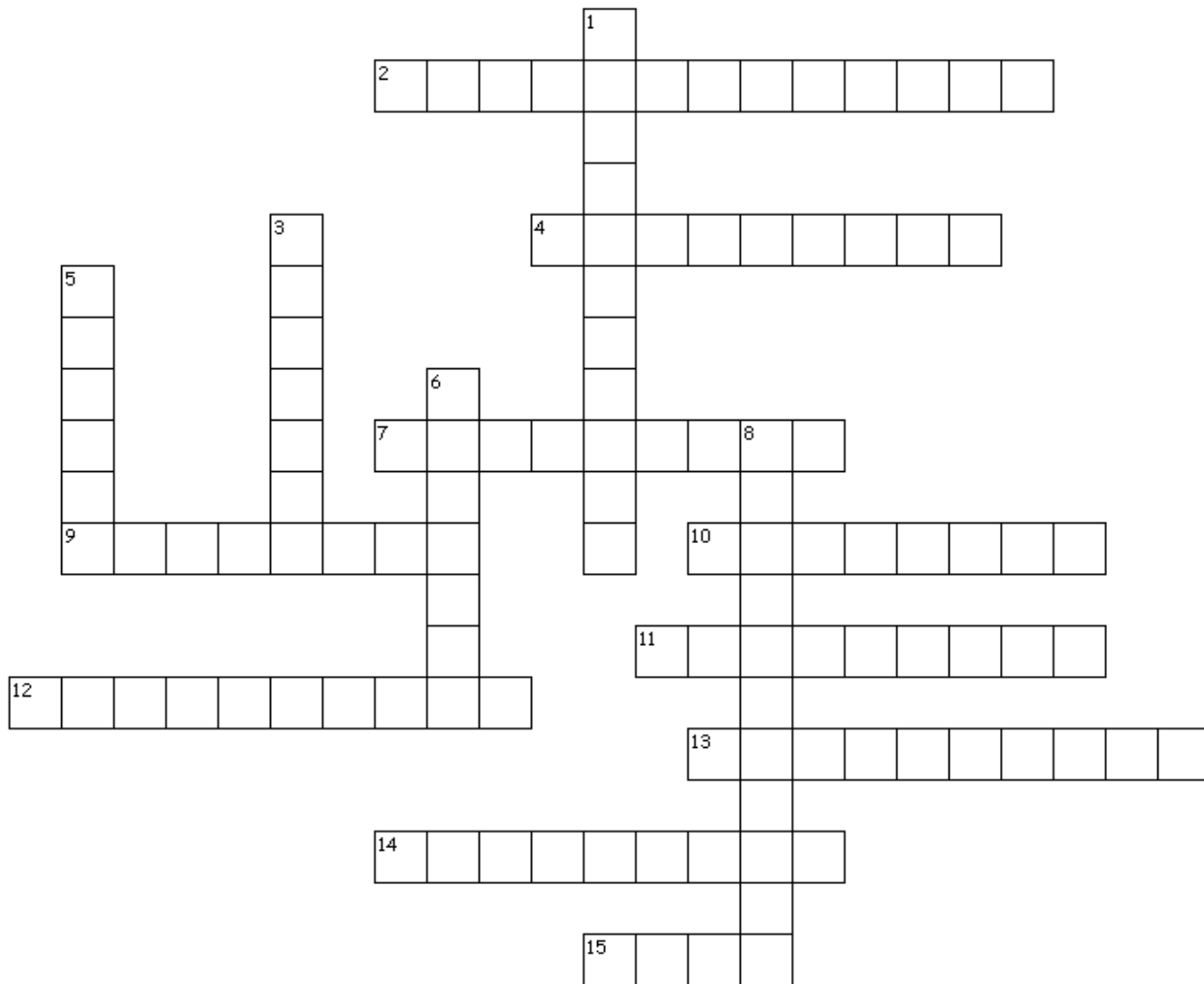

- 2. A weak pastern having too much slope for the breed.
- 4. A tail with a long fringe of hair on the tail that covers either part of the tail.
- 7. The hocks turn in towards each other and the toes point out.
- 9. A tail that curls in a circle.
- 10. Ear carried erect and usually pointed at the top.
- 11. A tail that extends level with the topline, then drops down and levels off.
- 12. A dip in the topline between the withers and hips.
- 13. Eyes that appear to have three corners.
- 14. An ear with a flap that folds forward, with the tip laying close to the skull.
- 15. The way the top and bottom teeth meet when a dog closes his mouth.

Down

- 1. Bowed front legs, with elbows out from body, pasterns close together and toes pointing out.
- 3. A round, compact foot with short digital bones and well-arched toes that are tightly bunched together.
- 5. An ear that is carried erect with a rounded tip.
- 6. The dog's outline from just behind the withers to the tail set.
- 8. Defined as the combined visual effects of ear placement and position on the skull, together with the uses of the ear.
