

### **ACROSS**

- The ability of the horse to control his action in order to travel in a collected manner and in correct form.
- An expression used when a horse's motion seems excessively difficult to perform.
- This is a reference to a horse that shows a lot of action when moving
- The characteristic style in which the horse lifts his front and hind feet high.

### **DOWN**

- 1 The time used to make one stride.
- The rhythm in which footfall sequences occur.
- The foot is carried in a straight line, without deviation, during the stride.
- The distance between successive imprints of the same foot.
