

4-H Club Leaders,

Thank you for everything you have done to make 2025 a successful year for 4-H. We had over 3500 projects exhibited at fair, 1820 animals exhibited, with 482 youth exhibiting a project. Your clubs, educational programs, and recruitment are truly helping to raise our kids & community in a positive light.

As we look forward towards the future, we encourage you to reach out to the extension office for anything you may need.

I would like to offer some general 4-H fun events during the fair. **Things like Farmer Ninja Warrior Course and Mini Golf Championships.** If you or someone you know would be interested in helping organize one of these events, please let me know, we can talk.

A few reminders, Make sure volunteer enrollment is done before any interactions with youth. New 4-H year started Oct 1.

People that serve on bank accounts or help in other ways should also have the volunteer training in 4honline completed.

We need to make sure that 2 unrelated & approved volunteers are on bank accounts. People that served in the past and unwilling to do the 4h volunteer paperwork need to be taken off the accounts. I highly suggest 3-4 parents of kids be on all bank accounts. I do request that the statements be sent to the 4-H office, it becomes easier to file taxes if we get copies.


