Financial Cost


The cost of the class for an individual is \$175. Couples in the same household sharing a manual attend for \$270. This fee covers supplies, classroom expenses, name badges, and the manual (over 600 pages!).

Volunteer Requirement

Volunteer hours are part of the expectation to become a Master Gardener. Volunteer hours focus on educational plant-related projects that teach others, thereby fulfilling the Master Gardener motto of "Helping Others Grow." Those who take the class and pass the final exam are considered 'interns' until 40 volunteer hours have been completed within two years.

Schedule

The orientation class is Wed. September 4, from 1–4 p.m. After orientation, regular classes will be held *Monday* afternoons, beginning Sep. 9, from 1- 4 p.m. (see enclosed *preliminary schedule*).
