2026 Extension Transitions

in Orange County



In 2026, Purdue Extension began transitioning counties across Indiana to a new service-based contract model. Current educators will continue to embrace a team-based approach, focusing on their areas of expertise to meet the unique needs of the communities we serve.

State and regional specialists will expand their local engagement, bringing more expertise and resources directly to local communities. Specifically in Orange County, a minor adjustment to Julie Harris and Veronica Portillo's program area responsibilities have recently changed. Julie will be serving as the 4-H Youth Development Extension Educator and Veronica Portillo will be serving as the Health and Human Sciences Extension Educator. Veronica will also be assisting in Crawford County, as we currently have a vacancy for HHS in Crawford County. Just as Veronica will be assisting a neighboring county, neighboring Agriculture and Natural Resources Extension Educators and state specialists will be assisting Orange County with ANR needs. Julie Harris will also be able to assist, but her initial focus is on 4-H Youth Development.

NOURISH AND LEAD GRANT OPPORTUNITY FOR 4-H CLUBS

Orange County 4-H received a grant from the Smithville Charitable Foundation to support our Nourish & Lead: A Countywide 4-H Service, Nutrition & Leadership Initiative. This project provides clubs the opportunity to incorporate nutrition education, leadership, and community service into their meetings through activities such as preparing healthy snacks or meals, learning about food safety, reading food labels, exploring MyPlate, or discussing budgeting and grocery cost comparisons.

Clubs are also encouraged to support the community by stocking local Blessing Boxes with healthy nonperishable foods, hygiene items, or seasonal items. If a club chooses not to host a food activity at every meeting, those resources can also be directed toward helping keep Blessing Boxes stocked for community members in need or other education activities. The Extension Office also has cooking and meal preparation equipment available for clubs to borrow, including electric skillets, griddles, kid-safe knives, cutting boards, and other supplies.

If your club would like to participate, please contact Julie or the Extension Office and share your upcoming meeting dates. Advance communication helps our office assist with planning activities, coordinating supplies, and ensuring we meet required grant reporting deadlines. We are excited to see how our 4-H youth can lead through service while learning important healthy living and life skills!



BLESSING BOXES

IMPORTANT IDENTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS:

- ✿ **Every 4-H member** planning to exhibit livestock at the County or State Fair **MUST attend Tag Day** & complete ID Worksheets to be eligible for exhibition.
- ✿ All animals **MUST be properly ID'ed** to be shown at the County or State Fair.
- ✿ **ALL** Beef, Dairy, Goat, Horse & Pony, Rabbits, Sheep, & Swine **MUST be properly identified in 4-H Online** before **MIDNIGHT** on **May 15, 2026**.
- ✿ Any animal exhibited at the Indiana State Fair **MUST have a DNA hair sample on file**. DNA samples **MUST be turned in** to the Extension Office by May 15, 2026.

Purdue Extension educators provide multiple opportunities for youth in their county to complete the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care in-person program but will not offer it close to the county fair. 4-H exhibitors may complete online YQCA up to project check in for their livestock projects. Any 4-H exhibitor failing to complete I4-HQLC or YQCA before arriving at the fair to check-in their animal(s) will not be permitted to advance through the fair's check-in process until YQCA has been completed online.
