# WHY YOUTH PROTECTION IN 4-H MATTERS: A MESSAGE FROM YOUR EXTENSION EDUCATORS

As Orange County 4-H Educators, we understand that the volunteer enrollment and youth protection process can sometimes feel burdensome or overly detailed. Many of you have expressed concerns about background checks, training modules, and the online process involved. However, we want to take a moment to explain why these steps are not just necessary, but essential to the mission and integrity of our 4-H program.

4-H is more than a club—it's a trusted, educational, and developmentally enriching space where young people grow into leaders, innovators, and responsible citizens. At the heart of this work are caring adult volunteers like you who serve as mentors, teachers, and role models. Ensuring that every child is safe in our program is not only a legal requirement—it's a moral obligation.

Youth protection policies are in place for several reasons:

- To protect our youth from potential harm—intentional or unintentional—by ensuring that adults in positions of authority have undergone proper screening and training
- To protect our volunteers and staff by providing clear expectations, guidelines, and protocols that reduce liability and foster trust between families and the program
- To preserve the reputation and integrity of Indiana 4-H, ensuring that it remains a safe, welcoming, and inclusive environment for all families

We know it takes time and effort to complete the necessary steps. But when you choose to follow through, you're doing more than checking a box—you're making a statement. You're saying to every child in Orange County, "You matter. Your safety matters. Your future matters." And that speaks louder than any words ever could.

Let's not see youth protection as a hurdle, but as an opportunity—an opportunity to build a community where every child feels seen, safe, and supported. That's the kind of legacy we get to create—together.

Our youth are watching. When they see adults take these responsibilities seriously, they learn what it means to be accountable, respectful, and community-minded. That's the kind of modeling that changes lives.

So thank you—for your time, your patience, and your continued dedication to making 4-H a safe and positive space for every child.

## Community Impact



Ninebark (Physocarpus opulifolius)

A hardy, adaptable shrub, with arching branches, spring flowers, and yellow fall foliage.




Black Chokeberry (Aronia melanoc<u>arpa)</u>

A larger shrub with spring flowers, fall fruit, and beautiful red fall foliage similar to burning bush.



<u>Coralberry</u> (Symphoricarpos orbiculatus)

A naturally compact shrub, with delicate flowers and bright pink fruit.



Need some tools to get the job done? Ask about one of our free invasive control kits!


After a site visit with Invasive Specialist Emily Finch, you'll receive a bucket with a pair of loppers, a folding saw, and optional herbicide materials to apply to cut stumps, keeping your invasives from coming back.

Additional tools, including a weed wrench, available to borrow.



Payment and rental agreement should be brought to the fairgrounds the day of storage. Storage charge will be \$130.00 for up to 18 feet in length, plus \$5.00 per foot over 18 feet. This is the entire length of your unit, not the length of the boat/vehicle.

Please make your check payable to Orange County 4-H Incorporated and give it to the custodian when your item is put into storage on November 8. If you cannot make it during this time, please telephone (812)723-7107 to make a special appointment.

- ~ At the time of storage, ALL portable fuel tanks and batteries are to be removed from the premises.
