
"LEARN BY DOING"

Mini 4-H serves as an introduction to the 4-H program. Mini 4-H members are able to gain self-confidence and increase their self-esteem. Mini 4-H provides youth guidance while learning a variety of skills. Youth develop pride and skills in their ability to complete and display their projects. The intent is to allow the Mini 4-H member to have fun and enhance youth development and readiness for 4-H participation. Mini 4-H members are encouraged to attend 4-H Club meetings. At these meetings, you will learn more about 4-H, make new friends, and have fun.

Mini 4-H Requirements:

- 1. Enrolled in Kindergarten, 1st , 2nd grades on January 15th of the current exhibition year**
- 2. Complete registration on v2.4honline.com**
- 3. Attend Mini 4-H Club meetings or camps when possible**

Mini Poster Requirements



ALL POSTER EXHIBITS MUST:

- Have a **solid, stiff backing, which is 14" high by 22" wide.** Poster boards can be purchased at the extension office.
- Be positioned HORIZONTALLY.***
- Have a total exhibit board **no larger than 14" high by 22" wide.**
- Be completely ***COVERED BY A CLEAR PLASTIC material. (covers may be purchased at the Extension Office)***

NON-COMPETITIVE POLICY:

The non-competitive learning environment for Mini 4-H includes:

1. Planned learning activities in which children are invited to be active and explore materials and ideas without the pressure of completing a specific product or exhibit.
2. Low adult/leader to child ratio that allows time for adults/leaders to provide individual, positive encouragement and assistance.
3. Simple, interesting activities that are fun.
4. Encouragement of children to participate in a group activity by sharing and or displaying their activity projects.
5. Rewards that are identical and/or ribbons of the same color for everyone. DO NOT JUDGE projects, but instead discuss them with the child.

Safety Policy: The safety and well-being of 4-H youth is of the utmost importance. Although kindergarten is specified as the time when a child may begin participation in some 4-H events and activities, parents are encouraged to take into consideration their child's physical and mental development before agreeing to let the child begin to show, work with, or care for animals. Each child matures at a different rate, and children in grades K-2 may still be too young to begin showing, working with, or caring for animals. The Indiana 4-H Youth Development Program at Purdue University has agreed to allow Mini 4-H members in grades K-2, to participate in non-competitive animal projects subject to certain conditions. These conditions are specified below. "Mini 4-H members, in grades K through 2, will be allowed to show, work with, or care for animal projects after their parent or legal guardian has signed a liability release. Mini 4-H members may independently show, work with, or care for animals that weigh 300 pounds or less. Mini 4-H members may only show, work with, or care for animals over 300 pounds when they are assisted by a parent, legal guardian, or another adult designated in writing by parent or legal guardian." (The word assisted means that the adult has control of the animal at all times.) Mini 4-H members are not required to own the animals they participate with in Mini 4-H. All animals on exhibit should meet the regulations of the Indiana Board of Animal Health Requirements for Exhibition of Domestic Animals in Indiana and meet the vaccination requirements set by Indiana 4-H. Mini 4-H members exhibiting horses must wear ASTM or SEI standard F1163 (or above) certified helmets whenever mounted. The parent/guardian is responsible to see that this specified headgear is properly fitted with the approved harness in place and fastened whenever a rider is mounted.

4-H Clubs & Projects

4-H Clubs provide a safe and learning environment where members can belong, practice service to others, demonstrate leadership, and gain or improve life skills. 4-H clubs belong to the members and have youth and leadership and have youth decision-making. An approved and screened adult volunteer serves as an advisor to the club.

There are two types of 4-H clubs, community clubs and project clubs. Community clubs include members enrolled in various 4-H projects, while project clubs focus on a specific 4-H project. Mini 4-H members are encouraged to participate in a 4-H community club.

Mini 4-H members gain age-appropriate knowledge and skills that can be demonstrated at 4-H club meetings, workshops, or through exhibits at the 4-H Fair. The non-competitive nature of Mini 4-H allows the projects to be more flexible than the 4-H project offerings for members in grades 3-12.

Mini 4-H members should explore a topic of interest and share their learning with others. A poster or simple exhibit at the 4-H Fair is a popular way that Mini 4-H members share their learning.


Mini 4-H Showmanship





Mini 4-H members may choose to show any or all of the following animals in the Mini Showmanship show during the Pike County Fair:


WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

Kindergarten-2nd grade:

- Make a poster of an insect or spider and label the body parts

- Collect 5 insects and display them in a case with a lid. Label them.
- Create models of different kinds of insects or spiders
- Make a scrapbook of different types of insects and spiders and label them
- Cut out different pictures of insects and display them on a poster.

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Mini 4-H Cake Decorating



Let's have fun learning about decorating cakes and cupcakes! Your project should start with an idea. Think about what you like to do or what interests you such as a hobby, sports team, 4-H, color or any other thing in your life that you find exciting.

You will use this idea to come up with a way to decorate your cake!

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

Kindergarten:

- 3 cupcakes that are iced and decorated with toppings.
 - Only one tip should be used to ice cupcakes.
 - Toppings might include: candies, nuts, raisins, chocolate chips, coconut or any other suitable toppings you find. You may NOT use pre-made frosting decorations.

Be sure to place the cupcakes in a clear plastic tin that you can obtain from the Extension Office.

1st Grade:

- 3 iced cupcakes using decorations with your choice of frosting, colors, and tips.
 - *You may only use two different tips.*

Be sure to place the cupcakes in a clear plastic tin that you can obtain from the Extension Office.

2nd Grade:

- A decorated simple 1 layer (8" or 9") square or round cake using your choice of frosting, colors, and 3 or more different tips.
 - Cake should be a dummy cake and not a real cake.
- **Exhibit cake on a piece of cardboard covered with foil. Do not cover with plastic.**

Mini 4-H Cake Decorating

Basic supplies you might want to have on hand:

- One or two 12 or 14 inch decorator's bag
- At least one 2-piece coupler
- #3 writing tip (used for writing, lettering, outlining, flower stems)
- #67 leaf tip (used to make leaves and borders)
- #16 and #22 star tips (used for stars and borders)

Simple Royal icing recipe:

- $\frac{1}{3}$ cup meringue powder
- 2lbs. confectioner's sugar (powdered sugar)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup warm water
- $\frac{1}{4}$ cup corn syrup
- 1 tsp. flavoring (clear)


Tips for where to buy cake decorating supplies:

- Wal-Mart
- Craft stores such as Michaels, JoAnn Fabrics, or Hobby Lobby

Common words used in cake decorating:

- **Border:** A cake border is just what it sounds like...a border that goes around the cake either on the top of the cake or the bottom or both.
- **Icing coupler:** You add these to your piping bags and it allows you to switch out your piping tips!
- **Piping:** Piping is just squeezing icing out of a piping bag generally onto a cake. You can pipe words, flowers and other designs.
- **Piping bag:** A bag that holds your icing while you pipe the design onto the cake.

Mini 4-H Collections




Let's have fun learning about collections! Collecting items can be a very fun thing to do! Did you know that museums are collections? You will learn about different ways to collect and display your items in this project. Have fun!

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

Grades Kindergarten-2nd Grade:

- Collect and exhibit 5 items or 5 pairs of items. If you take a collection to the fair more than one year, add 5 more articles to your collection each year.
 - These items can be rocks, coins, insects, cups, pencils, trading cards, pins or any kind of fun collection.
 - You may display them in a box or take pictures of them and put them in a scrapbook or on a poster board.
 - Attach a card that tells what you are collecting and why you collected the items
- Create a poster over a famous collection
 - Check out the Smithsonian Museum of Natural History Virtual Tour and create a poster over some of the items in the museum that you see. Be sure to use captions on your pictures. Use at least 5 images.
- Create a poster of your dream collection (5 minimum images)
 - What would you collect? Why? Where would you look for these items? What is your dream collectable?

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
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Mini 4-H Computers




Let's have fun learning about computers! You will learn to use different technology to complete your project. Before you begin, read the instructions carefully and have fun!

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

- *8.5 X 11 inch flyer*
 - *Join 4-H, Birthday party invitation, farm advertisement. etc.*
- *8.5 X 11 inch digital drawing*
 - *You may use any digital app to create your drawing*
- *Create a poster over different computer programs (5 minimum images)*
 - *Microsoft programs, coding software, etc.*
- *Create a poster over your favorite computer game (5 minimum images)*

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
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Mini 4-H Crafts

Kindergarten



- A finished product from a pre-made craft kit

- An original finished product (no pre-made craft kit)
 - Freehand drawing or painting, macramé, ceramics, woven basket, paper mache craft, salt or clay sculpture, candle, tie-dye, etc.



Mini 4-H Flowers




Let's have fun learning about flowers! You will learn to identify and select flowers. Before you begin your project, read the instructions carefully and be sure to have fun!

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

Kindergarten-2nd grade:

- A poster containing 7 different images of flowers.
 - Label your poster "Mini Flowers"
 - Be sure to label each flower
- Three single cut flowers in a bottle or vase
 - Attach a label that tells what kind of flowers you are exhibiting
- A flowering plant in a pot (***must have a drip tray***).
 - Attach a small label that tells the kind of flowering plant.
 - You will be responsible for watering your plant at the fair.
- A house plant in a pot (***must have a drip tray***).
 - Attach a small label that tells the kind of plant.
 - You will be responsible for watering your plant at the fair.





- A poster you made that shows at least three kitchen safety rules.
- 3 muffins of your choice.

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
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Mini 4-H Foods Recipe



No-Bake Cookies

Ingredients

- 1/2 cup butter (1 stick)
- 2 cups sugar 1/4 cup
- cocoa 1/2 cup milk 3
- cups oats 1/2 cup
- peanut butter 1 tsp
- vanilla

Instructions



1. Add oats, peanut butter, and vanilla to medium size bowl. Set aside. 2. Stir the butter, sugar, cocoa, and milk together in a saucepan, and cook on medium heat until it boils.

Turn the heat down to low and boil at a low rolling boil for 3 minutes.

3. Remove from heat and add the oats, peanut butter, and vanilla from the bowl. Stir quickly until thoroughly mixed.

4. Drop cookies by the spoonful onto wax paper. Let the chocolate no bake cookies to cool and set before enjoying.



 - This can be displayed on an 8.5X11 inch piece of card stock or a poster board
- Write a story or poem about your favorite tree
- Plant a tree and make a photo album of you planting the tree
- Make a poster or book showing things people can do to help trees or showing things people use that come from trees.

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Mini 4-H Garden

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:

Kindergarten-2nd grade:

- A paper plate with a maximum of three vegetables that you have grown.
 - Attach a small label with the types of vegetables you are displaying.
- A scrapbook with pictures of different types of vegetables.
 - Label each vegetable with its name.
 - *Label your scrapbook "Mini Garden"*
- One vegetable plant in a pot no larger than 10 inches in diameter.
 - You must have taken care of your plant for at least two (2) months before judging. Must have a drip tray.
- Create a poster displaying 7 different types of vegetables and label them.
 - *Label your poster "Mini Garden"*

WHAT TO EXHIBIT:


Kindergarten-2nd grade:

 - Other ideas include pictures of pets with funny captions or how to care for a pet.


1st Grade:
