Notes to ALL Livestock Exhibitors

- All identification **MUST** be completed and entered into 4-H Online by **May 15, 2022**
- This is a list for Pike County requirements **ONLY**. Exhibitors wishing to show at **State Fair** should refer to the 2022 Indiana 4-H Animal Identification document found in the Scoop or contact the Extension Office.
- All animals should be prepared to go through a veterinary inspection upon arrival at fairgrounds
- Exhibitors enrolled in Cattle, Goats, Poultry, Rabbits, Sheep, and Swine are **REQUIRED** to take YQCA Training each year, either in-person or online.
