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1. Harris Hall Horticulture Building will be open daily during the fair. On show days, the building will open once judging is completed. On Sunday, the building will open at 12:00 p.m. During non-show days, the building will open at 12:00 p.m. Building will close daily at 9:00 p.m. Please note that there is a gate fee when entering the Putnam County Fairgrounds.
2. All entries must be in Harris Hall before entry time is over for each specified exhibit. Times are listed on page 4. No exhibit may be altered by the exhibitor once entry time has closed.
3. The Superintendent shall have the right to remove any entry, or part thereof, at any time.
4. All entries will be released on Friday, July 29<sup>th</sup> from 6:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. and from 9:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, July 30<sup>th</sup>. **NO EXHIBITS WILL BE RELEASED EARLY. NO GARDEN OR OPEN-CONTAINER EDIBLE EXHIBITS WILL BE RELEASED TO EXHIBITORS.** Due to health concerns, all edibles will be disposed of.
5. Exhibiting is open to residents of Putnam County, Putnam County Extension Homemakers Club Members, Putnam County Master Gardener Members and parents of Putnam County 4-H members. Putnam County 4-H Members are encouraged to participate.
6. **Only one entry, per person, per class is permitted.** Children age 4 thru 2nd grade will enter exhibits in the Lil' Sprouts Program.
7. Judges are not required to award prizes to unworthy exhibits, whether or not there is competition.
8. An Overall Rookie Exhibitor award and Overall Harris Hall Exhibitor award are given out based on points earned by exhibiting in Harris Hall.
9. The Putnam County Fair & 4-H Club Association will not be responsible for the loss or damage to exhibits. Containers will not be judged except in Artistic Arrangements and Market Exhibits. If using valuable containers in any exhibit, do so at your own risk.

10. All entry tags must be uniform and will be furnished. Sample entry tags appear on pages 11, 19, 21, 24, 29, and 34. Please do not fold up the bottom of the entry tag.
11. Participants are allowed to use mailing labels on entry tags to complete the address portion of the tag.
12. If you have any questions during fair, a Harris Hall Volunteer in a green apron will be happy to help. The Putnam County Master Gardeners serve as Harris Hall Volunteers/Hosts.

- A. Please include variety name on tag.
- B. For questions on recommended size, please refer to Suggested 4-H Garden Exhibits 4-H-970-W on the Internet. <https://www.extension.purdue.edu/extmedia/4h/4-h-970-w.pdf>
- C. A Champion and Reserve Champion ribbon may be awarded in the following categories: Beans, Cabbage, Carrot, Cucumbers, Eggplant, Onions, Peppers, Potato, Squash, Tomatoes, Unlisted Variety, Rookie Garden Specimen, and Market Exhibit.
- D. A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion ribbon for Overall Garden will be chosen from among the Champion Garden entries listed in C above and all other first and second place Garden entries (not listed in C above) and respective Reserve Champions. Market Exhibit and Novelty winners are not included.
- E. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each Novelty category.
- F. A Rookie Garden (by points) award is given to the rookie garden exhibitor with the most garden points.
- G. Largest-by-weight cabbage and pumpkin (exhibited in squash – other) may be entered in two classes.
- H. Garlic and Horseradish will be shown in Herbs.

Tomatoes should have stems removed. Cherry tomatoes must be less than 2 inches in diameter.

- c. Pink or purple - 3 tomatoes

1 example of any fruit or vegetable that is an unusual shape

Exhibit a representative sample that is similar to other exhibited produce.

**27. MARKET EXHIBIT**

Each exhibitor must furnish their own container (examples of containers are baskets, soup bowls, etc.) and Putnam County Fair will not be responsible for the loss or damage to the container. Exhibit must contain at least 3-6 vegetables and/or herbs, any variety. **Must contain a recipe.** Provide one example of each vegetable that will be used for the recipe. You do not need to provide the amount called for in the recipe.

## SINGLE CUT FLOWER SPECIMENS

Coordinator – Yvonne Clifford

All single cut flower specimen exhibits must be entered and in place on Saturday, July 23<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.

**Judging will begin at 12:00 pm.** An attempt will be made to live stream the judging to the Putnam County Master Gardener Facebook page.

- A. “Cut specimen” means that the bloom has been severed from the parent plant with a section of stem and foliage attached. Stem length will vary in proportion to the size of the bloom and the nature of the plant. Stems are to be cut at an angle.
- B. Flowers are to be clean, fresh and free of pollen. Specimens may be groomed for presentation.
- C. Flowers are of one variety and are uniform in size.
- D. Containers will be provided for all entries.
- E. No foliage should be under water. Leaves should be clean, healthy and undamaged.
- F. Count to make sure you have the right number of blooms as specified in each category. **Remember to remove buds as specified; buds are considered another bloom.**
- G. No purchased flowers or greenery. All must be from home sources.
- H. ***Please include species and/or variety name on tag.***
  - I. The first and second places in each major category will be considered for Champion and Reserve Champion, respectively.
- J. A Champion and Reserve Champion ribbon will be awarded in each category.
- K. An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the Champions and Reserve Champions.
- L. An Overall Rookie Cut Flower Exhibitor award is given to the rookie exhibitor with the most cut flower points.

**1. ANNUAL & TENDER PERENNIALS NOT LISTED IN ANOTHER CATEGORY**

1 bloom or stem. **MUST INCLUDE SPECIES NAME**

Items will not be accepted if there is a listed category. These would be plants not labeled to grow in USDA Hardiness Zones 1-6. Examples include cannas and elephant ears.

Remove buds, 1 bloom

- a. Ball
- b. Cactus and/or semi-cactus
- c. Collerette
- d. Orchid
- e. Pompon
- f. Any other not listed

**6. DAISY**

1 stem

- a. Shasta
- b. Gerbera
- c. Any other Daisy not listed above

**7. DAYLILY**

One whole stem including whatever is on it. Anthers should be removed. Color is determined by the predominate color of blooms.

- a. Large – 4 ½” or larger bloom
  - 1. White or cream
  - 2. Red, pink or rose
  - 3. Yellow, lemon or green
  - 4. Orange, apricot or buff
  - 5. Other
- b. Small – 3”– 4 ½” bloom
  - 1. White or cream
  - 2. Red, pink or rose
  - 3. Yellow, lemon or green
  - 4. Orange, apricot or buff
  - 5. Other
- c. Other
  - 1. Miniature – Less than 3” bloom
  - 2. Double
  - 3. Spider

Remove buds. EACH BLOOM MUST BE ON ITS OWN INDIVIDUAL STEM IN ALL CLASSES. Bicolor means 2 distinct colors, e.g., red & white, purple & white.

- a. 1 color, not bicolor
  1. Single, 5 blooms, all same color
  2. Double, 5 blooms, all same color
  3. Ruffled, 5 blooms, all same color
- b. Bi-color and/or veined
  1. Single, 5 blooms
  2. Double, 5 blooms
  3. Ruffled, 5 blooms
- c. "The Petunia Patch" – single, 5 blooms, 2 or more colors, not bicolor

1 stem

- a. Any color
- b. Bicolor

**19. ROOKIE SPECIMEN**

Bring a representative size sample of a single species to be displayed.

**MUST BE FIRST TIME OPEN CLASS FLOWER EXHIBITOR.**

**20. ROSE**

Leave foliage on. Should be open  $\frac{1}{2}$  to  $\frac{3}{4}$  (should not be shown in bud stage.)

- a. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, Red, 1 bloom
- b. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, Pink, 1 bloom
- c. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, Yellow, 1 bloom
- d. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, Orange, apricot, salmon or coral, 1 bloom
- e. Hybrid Tea or Grandiflora, White or any other color not listed above, 1 bloom

- e. Green, 3 blooms
- f. Peppermint, 3 blooms

All container gardening exhibits must be entered and in place on Saturday, July 23<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. **Judging will begin immediately after the Cut Flower judging ends.** An attempt will be made to live stream the judging to the Putnam County Master Gardener Facebook page.

- A. The first and second places in each category will be considered for Champion and Reserve Champion, respectively.
- B. A Champion and Reserve Champion ribbon will be awarded in each category.
- C. An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from the Champions and Reserve Champions.
- D. Containers must have been planted at least 6 weeks prior to the fair.
- E. A stand will be provided for the Hanging Plant categories.
- F. No accessories allowed except in fairy gardens.
- G. Exhibits may be moved prior to judging due to space limitations.
- H. **Please specify if you do not want your container watered.**

All entries must be entered and in place on Monday, July 25<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. **Judging will begin at 11:30 a.m.** An attempt will be made to live stream the judging to the Putnam County Master Gardener Facebook page.

- A. Exhibits will be judged based on the general appearance of each entry.
- B. A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion ribbon will be given to the best overall hay, honey, egg and maple products. Champion and Reserve Champion will be awarded in each novelty contest category.
- C. Exhibits may not be shown in more than one class. Exhibitor may not make more than one entry per class.
- D. All entries must be grown or raised by the exhibitor in the most recent growing season.
- E. Each exhibit of machine-baled hay should consist of one flake or its equivalent and displayed in plastic bags that will be provided.
- F. Moisture content should be low enough that, in the opinion of the judge, the hay would remain in good quality under average storage conditions. Each entry will be exhibited with the name of the exhibitor.
- G. Honey should be exhibited in a clear, unlabeled container.

All entries must be entered and in place on Monday, July 25<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m. **Judging will begin at 11:30 a.m.** An attempt will be made to live stream the judging to the Putnam County Master Gardener Facebook page.

- A. All single herb exhibits - with the exception of garlic and horseradish - will be shown in water. Containers will be provided by Harris Hall on the day of the exhibit.
- B. No foliage should be underwater.
- C. Stem length will vary in proportion to the size and the nature of the plant.
- D. Leaves should be clean, healthy and undamaged. Specimens may be groomed for presentation.
- E. Please include variety name, if known.
- F. To prepare herbs for exhibition, it is best to cut the herbs on the morning of judging and immediately place them in water to preserve freshness.
- G. A Champion and Reserve Champion ribbon may be awarded in the following categories: Basil, Chives, Dill Weed, Garlic, Mint, Parsley, Savory, Thyme, Wormwood, and Rookie Herb Specimen.
- H. A Champion and Reserve Champion ribbon will be awarded to the Unlisted Variety class.

Early entries may be submitted from 6:00 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. on Monday, July 25<sup>th</sup>. All artistic arrangements must be entered and in place on Tuesday, July 26<sup>th</sup>, from 8:00 a.m. – 10:30 a.m.

**Judging will begin at 12:00 p.m.** An attempt will be made to live stream the judging to the Putnam County Master Gardener Facebook page.

- A.** The first and second places in each division will be considered for Champion and Reserve Champion in their class.
- B.** A Champion and Reserve Champion may be awarded in the following classes: “Small Fry,” “In Good Taste,” “Sunrise-Sunset,” “Eventful,” and “Hiways & Byways.”
- C.** An Overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected from Champions and Reserve Champions.
- D.** Special awards will be given to the winner of the “All Roads Lead to the Fair” division and the winner of the “In the Beginning” division.
- E.** An Overall Artistic Exhibitor (by points) award is given to the artistic exhibitor with the most Artistic Arrangement points.
- F.** Artistic arrangements **MUST** be the work of the exhibitor.
- G.** Arrangements will be measured when a specific size is listed.
- H.** Arrangements **MUST** include colors or materials as listed.
- I.** Moss, foliage and oasis are permitted. Leaves on flower stems can count as greenery. Accessories are permitted only when specified. Anthers should be removed from lilies.
- J.** NOT permitted:
  - Wires, spray-painted flowers
  - Artificial flowers or greenery
  - **NO DAYLILIES**
  - Purchased flowers or greenery
- K.** All must be from home sources (except 2.c. and 5.b.).
- L.** All arrangements must be in a single container or vase.
- M.** All plant material must be cut.
- N.** Please note: arrangement may be moved prior to judging due to limited space.

- O.** Minimal adjustments to arrangements will be allowed on site/outside Harris Hall. We ask that you have your arrangements completed and ready to display before entering Harris Hall.
- P.** Exhibit tags should be placed at the back of the exhibit. Tags will be moved to the front of the exhibits after judging.

## 1. **SMALL FRY**

- a. TINY WONDERS– Not over 4” in any direction. Please measure.
- b. SMALL WONDERS- Not over 6” in any direction. Please measure.
- c. SOFT AND CUDDLY - All blue, all pink, all yellow or any combination of blue, pink and yellow flowers and greenery, suitable for the birth of a baby. Must include a small stuffed animal as an accessory.
- d. KID’S CORNER - Your choice using fresh flowers and greenery in a child-oriented container. May use child-oriented accessories. Not over 16” in any direction.
- e. TUSSIE-MUSSIE - A small bouquet popular in Victorian times as a gift. Needs to be exhibited in a container that will be considered part of the arrangement. Doilies and ribbons are permitted and will be included in the measurement. Not over 12” in any direction.

## 2. **IN GOOD TASTE**

- a. CUP OF KINDNESS - Pastel color flowers and greenery in a tea cup or mug. If exhibiting in a tea cup, saucer must be included. Tea cup or mug must have a handle.
- b. DAY OF WINE AND ROSES - Use at least three roses and greenery in a wine glass. Accessories permitted.
- c. MARKET TO MARKET – Your choice of fresh flowers and greenery using a fresh fruit or vegetable as a container. Fruit or vegetable can be purchased or home grown.
- d. WHAT’S COOKING? – Use a culinary element (such as an ingredient container or cooking vessel). Accessories permitted.
- e. GOOD ENOUGH TO EAT – Use only edibles (e.g., edible flowers, herbs, vegetable plants). May include non-palatable plants. Accessories permitted.



### 3. **SUNRISE - SUNSET**

- a. SUNBURST – 3 sunflowers and greenery in a decorative tin.
- b. A TISKET, A TASKET – Yellow flowers and greenery in a basket. Not over 24” in any direction.
- c. OH, HAPPY DAY – Zinnias and greenery in a container of your choice.
- d. HARVEST MOON – Marigolds and greenery. Accessories permitted.
- e. IKEBANA – Japanese style with 3 levels/elements representing sky, man and earth. Less is more; simplicity and negative space are characteristic of this style. Accessories permitted. Not over 30” in any direction.

### 4. **EVENTFUL**

- a. JUNE WEDDING – All white flowers with greenery suitable for a wedding.
- b. ENVY – Greenery only – no flowers, in a green container. May use green accessories.
- c. HAPPY HOLIDAYS – Any holiday theme. Flowers and greenery in a container pertaining to the holiday of your choice.
- d. GOD BLESS AMERICA – Any variety of red, white and blue flowers and greenery placed in a red, white or blue container (or any combination of these colors). Include all 3 colors of flowers. Accessories permitted.
- e. ARTIST’S CHOICE – Freedom to choose colors and theme. Accessories permitted. Must follow all general guidelines. Not over 30” in any direction.

## 5. HIWAYS AND BYWAYS

- a. LILIES OF THE FIELDS – Greenery and any lilies, **NO DAYLILIES.**
