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




UPCOMING EVENTS





WHAT ARE MINI 4-H PROJECTS?

Members have the opportunity to learn more about a subject matter that they choose to study through completing hands on activities. We refer to these as projects. In order to enroll in a project, members must sign up for them at the time of enrolling in 4-H. Each project has a manual that guides the youth through the learning process as well as a set of guidelines that helps them meet the project requirements. We provide adult volunteers and staff who are knowledgeable on that particular subject who will often times provide workshops to allow youth to learn about that topic in a social environment.

Projects are meant to be worked on over time, providing an educational opportunity for youth outside of the classroom setting. Often times, youth will exhibit and display their project at a local county fair in order to show the community what they have learned.



INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE

Indiana 4-H has developed a new in-person quality care assurance program for 2023. This program will replace the YQCA in-person trainings of years past. <u>All</u> Randolph County 4-H Exhibitors of beef cattle, dairy cattle, dairy goats, meat goats, poultry, rabbits, sheep and swine are <u>REQUIRED</u> to complete an approved quality assurance program. Youth will not be permitted to show at the county fair or state fair without completing one of the following quality assurance programs:

1. NEW in-person Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training will be led by 4-H Extension Educators. This engaging and interactive workshop will introduce best management practices for raising livestock. The content will change each year. The cost of this program is \$3 per person at the door.

2. Online YQCA will be accepted for 2023. Youth who have tested out of YQCA or have taken YQCA in the past 12 months can print their certificate and submit that to the Randolph County Extension Office to satisfy their quality assurance requirement. The online course is \$12 per person and can be obtained at www.yqcaprogram.org.
