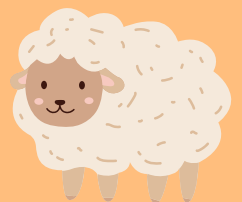

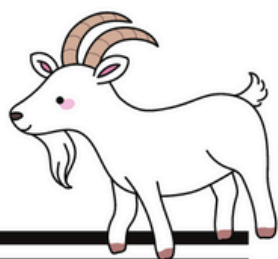

The Recipe Corner

Southwestern Pasta Salad



Ingredients:

- 2 Ears Corn, shucked
- 1 Box Medium Shell Pasta
- 3/4 Cup Sour Cream
- 3/4 Cup Mayonnaise
- 1 Packet Ranch Seasoning Mix
- 1 Tbsp. Lime Juice
- 1/2 Tsp. Ground Cumin
- 1 Pack of Cherry Tomatoes, halved
- 1 Can Pinto Beans, drained
- 2 Avocados, diced
- 1 Bell Pepper, chopped
- 1/2 Red Onion, chopped
- 1 Cup Shredded Mexican Cheese Blend

Servings: 8-10

Instructions:

1.) Boil a large pot of water, then boil corn until tender. Remove the corn and rinse with cold water to cool.

2.) Next, put your pasta in the same boiling water, once tender drain pasta, rinse, and let cool.

3.) Blend together the sour cream, mayo, ranch seasoning, lime juice, and cumin.

4.) Cut the corn off the cobs. Then, in a large bowl combine your corn, cooled pasta, tomatoes, beans, avocado, bell pepper, onion, and cheese.

5. Once combined, fold in the dressing. Let that all chill and Enjoy!!
