Another year of 4-H has officially begun, which means it is now time to get enrolled for the upcoming year! The 4-H enrollment period is from October 1—January 15. The earlier you enroll, the more chances you have to participate in club activities, state events, and get the latest information on 4-H!

How to Sign Up for 4-H & Mini 4-H:

Enroll online at: https://v2.4honline.com
 Come to the Extension Office during office hours (8 am-4 pm, Monday-Friday)

You are highly encouraged to enroll online through the 4HOnline enrollment system. Included in the October Newsletter were the step-by-step instructions on how to enroll.

IMPORTANT: If you were in 4-H last year, you are already in the online system <u>regardless</u> of how you enrolled (online or paper enrollment). When you go to re-enroll this year, please <u>DO NOT</u> set up a whole new 4HOnline profile. In order to enroll through the online system, you will need to login with your email and password.

Adult Volunteer Re-Enrollment

As a reminder, all 4-H Volunteers must renew their volunteer status with our program yearly by signing an Adult Behavioral Expectation Form. The Youth Safety and Abuse Reporting training that is mandatory for all volunteers must be taken every year.

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2023 Fair Changes

- Fair Clean up will be Saturday 9am-Noon
- Load out of livestock will be on Friday from 6-10am
- Thank you notes must be turned in on the 3rd Monday after the auction to receive your check. Envelopes must be stamped and addressed before getting your check
- After October 1st, if your check has not been picked up the money will be put back into the sale committee account.
- Must check-in at the scales during the time slots or you will not be able to show (add under each animal that checks in at the scales)
- If you go to any of the fair set-up no need to complete livestock record sheet
- One master record sheet for non-state fair projects
- Must be able to provide verification of support animals to have them on the fairgrounds
- Fair closing time will be 11pm
- 911 committee to handle any issues that are time sensitive (3 members including 4-H Inc member, Educator, one 4-H leader)
- Mini Show
 - Move mini show to Thursday
 - · Rotation of Mini Show and leave set times
 - Mini livestock showing form will be due by Friday Need to add this to the Fairbook.
- Construction Toys place this under Art & Craft with State Fair. (Just one project)
- Sale Committee
 - Would like to have all sale participants posted in the barns on Monday and a rule added "No 4-H exhibitors will be added to the auction list after 12:00 Noon on Tuesday". Changes to animals can be made until 8 PM on Tuesday.
- Rabbits
 - o Move rabbit showmanship Monday on the Stage at 6pm
- Sheep/Goat Changes
 - o Showmanship: Must sign-up at the scales on Saturday. Will post classes
 - Add You must check-in at the scales. If you don't check-in at scales you can not show.
 - o Start Sheep show at noon on Sunday
 - Pizza party or meal for sheep/goat kids (social food hour) Saturday at 7:15pm would like to add to Fairbook
- Dress the Goat Wednesday at 6:30pm

• Swine

- Add Top 5 Purebred Barrows
- o Add Pork Producer Commercial Hog Class (after the grand drive)
 - commercial hogs can not sell in the Auction but can go on the out truck
- o Grand Champion Commercial Hog
- Rate of Gain of Commercial Hog

Beef

- Page 90 Rule 9 Change to you are required to use a show stick (add to beef and dairy beef steers)
- Page 68 Rule 7 Change to Check in during Friday at the scales for bred and owned
- \$20 per stall (based off of stalling form) (Dairy, Beef, Dairy Beef)

Horse and Pony

- Senior/10-Year Riders' requirement to take a final ride.
- o Complete Record Sheets and Turn them into Announcer Stand
- Provide full 4-H Vaccination requirement
- Follow dress code
- Horse-ridden must show in one halter class
- The horse that is being ridden must be entered online as the riders project horse according to the 4-H requirement.

• Items left in the barn

- No saddle/bridles/feed/hay, etc. to be left in horse barn aisle ways or open stalls during the fair.
- Rule # 24 add a statement of clarification due to two types of stalls:
- o This rule does not apply if your horse is in a newer updated fully enclosed stall
- o Time changes on events during the fair due to the extended length of the fair
- Awards are to start at 4 PM.
- o Contesting classes to begin at 5 pm or immediately following the awards
- o Thursday of fair to be used as a rainout date for Mini, or another show date.

• Show class changes:

- Add a halter class for Ranch horses
- o Rearrangement of classes for contesting night
- o Saturday Night 5-7 pm Parent Info Night

Other Items

- o Add a Res. Champion to Supreme Showmanship
- o Horse and Pony Round Robin Judge will be contacted by Julie and 4-H Inc will pay them
- State Fair Livestock (for everyone)
 - \$100 per species per exhibitor to leave the fair at the completion of the show. Only animals that can show at the State Fair
 - o Must have State Fair requirements checked before leaving
 - o ½ the money to producer group
 - o ½ the money to Future Needs for New Show Ring
 - You can leave from 7-9pm on the day of the show (or 2 hours after the completion of the show)
 - You must sign-up for leaving dismissal on Saturday 12-2pm in Conference room



INDIANA 2023 SCHOLARSHIP FOUNDATION 2023 OPPORTUNITIES

Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship, and a silver tray, will be awarded in each of these

categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership. Additional scholarships may be awarded depending on sponsorship availability. The number of scholarships awarded in each category may be adjusted to meet special criteria of a particular sponsor.
