

How to Sign Up for 4-H & Mini 4-H:

- Enroll online at: https://v2.4honline.com
- Come to the Extension Office during office hours (8 am-4 pm, Monday-Friday)

You are highly encouraged to enroll online through the 4HOnline enrollment system. Included on the next few pages are step-by-step instructions on how to enroll.

IMPORTANT: If you were in 4-H last year, you are already in the online system <u>regardless</u> of how you enrolled (online or paper enrollment). When you go to re-enroll this year, please <u>DO NOT</u> set up a whole new 4HOnline profile. In order to enroll through the online system, you will need to login with your email and password. Call the office you don't remember your email or need help resetting your passward.

Adult Volunteer Re-Enrollment

As a reminder, all 4-H Volunteers must renew their volunteer status with our program yearly by signing an Adult Behavioral Expectation Form. The Youth Safety and Abuse Reporting training that is mandatory for all volunteers must be taken every year.



















12. Click the Next button once all the member's projects have been added.



- 13. Click "Show Questions"
- 14. Complete the enrollment questions. Some of the questions will be completed for you based on what you entered when you created your record.

NOTE: Any questions with a red asterisk (*) are required. Questions may vary by Institution.



- 15. Complete the Health form fields and Consents.
- 16. Click the Next button at the bottom of the screen when you are done.

Note this is optional to fill out at this time, but it will still prompt you to sign the bottom of the screen.

You will receive an email to let you know your enrollment has been submitted. You will receive another email when your County Extension office has approved your enrollment. You may view the enrollment status on the Member List. Any enrollments that have fees to be paid by credit card will process when the County Extension Office approves the enrollment. Should the transaction be declined, you will receive an email notification. It will include a link to login so that you may add another card or change your payment method.

Broadband is defined by the Federal Communications Commission (FCC), a government entity that regulates telecommunications, as an internet connection that is always on and faster than dial-up.

DO I HAVE BROADBAND?

While the definition is a bit vague, it really means that if internet service available at your address (home business, organization, etc.) is slower than 25 megabits per second or Mbps download and 3 Mbps upload (Mbps refers to the amount of data that can be handled by your internet connection), 25/3 for short, then you are considered unserved. If you do have 25/3 Mbps service but not 100/20 Mbps available, then you are considered underserved. If either of these is the case, your address could be eligible for funds to provide service of at least 100/20 Mbps. In case you were wondering, "gig" service refers to speeds of 1,000 Mbps.
