Health & Safety Tip

Safety around Tractors

Why?

The most frequently used machine on the farm is the tractor. It is also the the machine associated with the most injuries on the farm.

When?

While manufacturers do their best to make tractors safe, it takes a responsible operator to ensure safety while operating a tractor.

How?


Always check that all components are working properly before use. This should include checking the tires, brakes, shields, steering, lights, and safety switches.

Safety rules when starting: The PTO must be disengaged. The gear shift should be in neutral or park, with the clutch disengaged. The path should be clear of any obstructions before moving. The power should be engaged slowly.

Safety rules when stopping: Signal before stopping, particularly on the road. Pull over onto the shoulder before stopping on the highway. Reduce speed before braking, and be extra carful in stopping when towing a load. Shift to park or set a parking break. Lower hydraulic equipment when leaving the tractor. Turn off all electrical switches and remove the key.

Premise ID Information

If you are showing livestock at the Fair make sure you know your Premise ID! You cannot exhibit animals without it. This is also required when entering animals on 4-H Online. Not sure what your premise ID is or if you have one? Contact BOAH and they will be happy to help.



STATE REQUIREMENTS

<u>Premises ID Number</u>

- Premises ID is required
- Easy to obtain through BOAH (Request online at: www.in.gov/boah/2642.htm email animalid@boah.in.gov or call 317-544-2400)
- Please note that a Premises ID number is required to enroll livestock in a 4-H fair



Animal Entry on 4-H Online

As a reminder, all livestock being exhibited at the fair **must be registered in 4-H Online by May 15th.** Not doing so will result in a violation of Indiana State 4-H Policy and the Ripley County 4-H Handbook which may result in the ineligibility to show these animals at the fair. If you need assistance with this process contact the Extension Office! The office will close at 4:00pm on May 15th.

Animal Identification


4-H members (Grades 3 – 12) must identify all Beef and Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Llamas, Sheep and Swine in the 4-H Online system by the species deadline or earlier county deadline if applicable to be eligible for exhibition.

 Beef and Dairy Beef Steers, Beef Heifers, Beef/Dairy Feeder Calves, Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Llamas, Sheep, and Swine must be entered into 4-H Online no later than May 15, 2024.

Animal Identification in 4-H Online

Please complete the following steps to identify your livestock in the 4-H Online system.

- Login to your family profile at: https://v2.4honline.com using your family email address and password associated with your 4-H enrollment record.
 - If you have forgotten your password, please use the 'Reset password' option on the 4-H
 Online login page, and you will be sent a new temporary password.
 - b. If you have forgotten your family email address or turned in a paper 4-H enrollment form, please contact your local Purdue Extension Office for assistance.
- 2. Click View next to the Member's record for whom you would like to add an animal




- 3. Click Animals in the navigation pane.
- 4. Click the blue "Add an Animal" button. (even if you have previous year animals that can be registered again, click "Add an Animal")





Animal Identification Continued

- 5. Click on "Add New Animal" to start adding a new animal or if you have animals that carry over from the previous year you "Register" those. Animals that can be registered from previous years must be REGISTERED every year by completing this step. You cannot select a previous year and assume they are there. Animals that carry over are Dairy Cattle Females, Horse&Pony, Llama&Alpaca, Dairy Goat Females, and Pygmy Goats (move onto step 9 if registering previous animal).
- 6. Select the appropriate animal type from the drop-down menu.
- Enter the required Tag, Tattoo, or Animal Name as directed for the first step that will then allow you to proceed to the remaining identification process.
- 8. Click Save.

- 9. Read the on-screen instructions for Animal ID requirements for County Fair and Indiana State Fair Exhibition.
- 10. Click on the button "Show Questions" after reading the instructions.
- 11. Required fields are indicated, but be sure to complete all other visible fields as applicable.
- 12. Click next once completed. If animals have been carried over, the ID information will already be there.
- Upload any files if required or necessary for the particular Animal type. For animals that are carried over, new photos and files must be uploaded each year.
- 14. Click next once completed.
- 15. Review the entered information. Use the Back button at the bottom of the page to return to the previous screen to make corrections if needed.
- 16. Once the entered information is correct and reviewed, click the Submit button.
- 17. The animal information will display on the screen with the status, created, modified, and submitted date and time stamp (local time). You will also receive a confirmation email upon submission.
- 18. To add more animals for the same member repeat steps 3-17. To add animals for another member return to the Member List and View another member.

Note Members are able to edit Animal ID information until the species specific Animal ID deadline of **May 15, 2024**. Click on the Animals tab from your account at any time to view the status for all of the animals for a member in the family.

Family Enrollment of Animals

Animals are automatically co-enrolled within the same family (Siblings and step-siblings). The animals may be identified under a single 4-H member in 4-H Online and be exhibited by a different sibling listed in the same family profile. With this capability in 4-H Online, animals do not need to be entered under each 4-H member in the family. The exhibit management program will allow a member to select to exhibit any animal identified by the family in 4-H Online. It is suggested that at least 1 animal be identified by each member enrolled in the project.

State Fair Animal DNA

DNA hair samples are required for all swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy cattle and beef cattle to be eligible for the Indiana State Fair 4-H Show. Collection envelopes are available from the Extension Office. Samples are due to the Ripley County office no later than **May 15, 2024 at 4:00PM.** To be eligible for your county fair and the Indiana State Fair, your animals must be completely and correctly identified in Indiana 4-H Online

Ripley County Extension Homemaker Scholarship

The Ripley County Extension Homemakers are offering one \$100 scholarship to a graduating senior. Scholarships can be picked up from the Ripley County Extension Office.

Eligibility:

- The applicant should be admitted or enrolled in a college, trade school, or apprenticeship program.
- Although not required, special consideration will be given to a person whose family member is associated with Ripley County Extension Homemakers and/or is currently enrolled in the Ripley County 4-H Program.
 - Completed Scholarships must be turned into the Ripley County Extension Office by May 31, 2024.

Manuals, Project Books, & Record Sheets



Beginning this year, manuals, project books, and record sheets will need to be picked up from the extension office. Club leaders may compile a list of club members who need books and share this list with the office to schedule a pick up. However, the office will not be pulling books for every 4-H member because often times we must refile many books that people do not pick up. You may be thinking "I need my books!" What should you do? There are two options:

- 1. Come by the office between 8:00 and 4:00 on a weekday. If you're coming for books, consider letting us know a head of time and we can pull what you need before you get here. Our number is 812-689-6511.
- 2. Communicate with your club leader. Ask if there are other members in you club that may also need books. Club leaders can give us your names and we can compile a pick up for your club.


