

Health & Safety Tip

Grain Bin Safety

Why?

Grain bins are great for storing grain or feed but they can be dangerous especially if it is being filled or emptied.

When?

Keep in mind these safety measures anytime you are near or working with Grain Bins.

How?


One of the most important rules to remember is that **no one should ever go inside a grain bin that is being loaded or emptied**. Flowing grain is like quick sand. It can trap, bury, and suffocate someone in just seconds. Anytime you have to enter a grain bin, take the following precautions:

- shut off and lock out the power
- use a safety harness and safety line
- wear a dust filtering respirator
- be sure there are several people available outside of the bin in case there is an emergency

Other considerations to help keep people safe around grain bins may include:

- labeling the bins to warn of entrapment hazards
- lock entrances to grain bins to keep bystanders and children out
- install ladders inside all bins

FairEntry Information

It's the time of year where we now ask 4-H members to complete FairEntry. FairEntry is the system we use to enter what projects you are bringing to the fair, make show bills, create judges packets, input results, and so much more.

It is highly important that you complete FairEntry by July 8th to be fully eligible to compete at the fair. According to the Indiana State 4-H Policies and Procedures Section 4.6 Exhibition

Deadlines, 4-H members who make no attempt to complete FairEntry, the following rules apply: For livestock projects: "Those missing this deadline may exhibit and will have opportunities to receive feedback from the judge. Youth may still participate fully in showmanship classes."

For non-livestock projects: "Those missing the deadline may compete and the highest placing is 'blue'."

If additions or corrections are needed after the 4-H member has attempted to complete FairEntry, these will be made without affecting the 4-H members participation. Please let the Extension Office know of any changes as soon as possible.

Helpful Tips:

- We suggest using Fire Fox or Chrome to complete FairEntry. Internet Explorer doesn't work well with FairEntry.
- Remember you will use your 4-H Online Login Email and Password to access FairEntry.
- You must be enrolled in a project in 4-H Online before you can add an Exhibit for the project in FairEntry. If you need a project added into 4-H Online please contact the office.
- Double check that all exhibitors have all their entries created before submitting! Once you click "Submit," you will not be able to make any changes online. You will not be able to add another exhibitor or any more entries until the first submission is processed. Each submission is reviewed by a staff member and either approved or sent back.
- If you have questions or need to make a change please just give us a call, we are open Monday - Friday 8AM-4PM except for Holidays.

Attached at the end of the Newsletter is a "Step by Step Guide for Entering Exhibits in FairEntry System." This guide should help with 4-Hers registering all projects.

FairEntry Information

There is often times confusion between 4-H Online and FairEntry. Please use the infographic to the right and the FAQ section below to help. if you have further questions don't hesitate to give us a call at 812-689-6511

Frequently Asked Questions:

"Who all must complete FairEntry?"

All 4-H members who are exhibiting a project or animals at the fair must complete FairEntry. Mini 4-H members are not required to complete FairEntry but are highly encouraged to as it is good practice for the future.

"What all should I enter into FairEntry?"

You should have 1 entry per exhibit hall project and 1 entry per animal that you plan to show at the fair. Don't forget to include entries for event type projects such as pocket pet, communications, and fashion revue.

"When do I complete FairEntry?"

FairEntry is open until **July 8, 2024**. If you have corrections after this date please contact the office ASAP.

"Where do I go to complete FairEntry?"

In a web browser, preferably Chrome or FireFox, search:

"Why do I have to do FairEntry?"

FairEntry is the System we use to let us know exactly what you're bringing to the fair. It also allows us to input results during the fair and share that information with the public.

"Didn't I already do that?"

You have likely completed half of the registration process through 4-H Online which is our Enrollment tool and Animal Identification tool. This FairEntry Process helps to tell us what exact projects or animals you are bringing to the fair.

STEP 1 PRE-PURCHASE

- Join 4-H if you haven't done so already and enroll in the project you wish to exhibit.

STEP 2 POST-PURCHASE

STEP 4 CHECK-IN

On-site at Indiana State Fair

- Animal ID is verified against records in 4-H Online
- Vet Check
- Animal Affidavit & Animal Husbandry Form is turned in
- Quality Assurance Program verification is completed
- Breed paperwork is verified, if applicable



STEP 3 EARLY SUMMER

- DNA due to local extension office by May 15
- Input Animal ID information into 4-H Online by May 15
- ISF Entry opens via Exhibitors Corner on May 16. [Enter Here](#)
- Complete Quality Assurance Training prior to respective county fair



IMPORTANT DATES

MAY 15 All Beef and Dairy Cattle, Goats, Horses, Llamas, Sheep, and Swine must be identified in 4-H Online. **AND** Beef and Dairy Cattle, Meat Goats, Sheep, and Swine DNA Hair Samples must be submitted by local County Extension Office.

MAY 16 Indiana State Fair Entries Open Entries can be made in Exhibitors Corner.

Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance:

If you plan to assist 4-H member who are not immediate family (father, mother, siblings) with grooming animals at the Indiana State Fair, you must complete the Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistance Program. For 2024 **only** there are two different options for becoming an Indiana 4-H Approved Animal Grooming Assistant. This process will be changing in the 2024- 2025 Indiana 4-H Program Year. Please review the options below to ensure you complete the necessary process.

Option 1 : If you are new to the program complete the 5 Animal Ethics and Adult Expectations online modules attached in this Qualtrics Survey, complete your application via this Qualtrics Survey, and also submit a copy of your valid Indiana driver's license via this Qualtrics. Option 2 : If you completed the program in 2023, please select that option to proceed to complete the Adult Expectations, application and submit your valid Indiana driver's license. https://purdue.ca1.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_2ugO9kFH9ENJWWa If you are unsure if completed the program in 2023, please contact your local Extension Office to have them check the list.

Pen Reservations

Any 4-H member exhibiting beef, dairy, goats, llama & alpaca, rabbits, sheep swine or poultry must complete and turn in the 2024 Pen reservation form. This form was sent in the mail, if you did not receive it call the office! Pen Reservations are due to the Extension office by Monday, July 1st at 4:00PM. There is a drop box outside the office to turn them in after hours or they can be returned by mail. There will be a \$25 late fee for anyone who does not return them on time.

Rabbit Meat Pen ID Day

ID Day for Meat Pen Rabbits and Fryer classes is July 12th from 6:30 - 8PM. All meat pen or fryer rabbits **MUST** attend!!! To have a meat pen, you must also exhibit 2 other adult rabbits. Contact the leaders with questions.



1. This certification must be done on an annual basis
2. Members must be registered **BEFORE** attending a training
3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer
OR a training in another county
OR complete the online YQCA training (**Proof of YQCA completion must be submitted to the Extension Office by July 13!**)





Step by Step Guide for Entering Exhibits in FairEntry System

Register for the Ripley County 4-H Fair:
May 16 – July 8, 2024

<p>1. Go to https://fairentry.com/Fair/SignIn/19551</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">- Recommended browsers: Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox. Older versions of Internet Explorer may cause unexpected results.- Register all entries for each exhibitor in the family before proceeding to the Payment section.- Be sure to click “submit” when you have completed your entries. Entries are not final until they have been submitted.	
<p>2. Select the “Sign in with your 4-H Online” option – the <u>GREEN</u> box</p>	
<p>3. A separate box will pop up where you can enter the login email address and password from 4HOnline.</p> <p><i>(If you don't remember your password, you will need to select the “I forgot my password” option to get a temporary one emailed to you. If your email address has changed, log in using the old email address and change it in 4-H Online.)</i></p> <p>4. Click the “Sign in” box.</p>	
<p>5. This will take you to the Welcome screen, where you will need to select the green box to “Begin Registration.”</p>
