

Health & Safety

<u>Hand washing and germ prevention: Wash</u> <u>Away Germs! Stay Healthy!</u>

Washing your hands is one of the easiest and best ways to stay healthy and stop the spread of germs! Make sure to wash your hands with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, that's about the time it takes to sing "Happy Birthday" twice. Scrub your palms, between your fingers, under your nails, and the backs of your hands. Always wash after using the bathroom, before eating, after playing outside, and after coughing or sneezing. If soap and water aren't available, hand sanitizer is a good backup. Germs can make you and others sick, even if you don't feel sick yourself. Keeping your hands clean helps protect you, your family, and your friends. Healthy habits like handwashing keep everyone feeling great and ready for school, sports, and fun!

4-H Project Books

For any 4-Her that would like their project books for the 2025-2026 4-H year, please let the office know by January 15th. <u>Please be aware, we may not have certain books available in the office if not requested by that time.</u>



Quality Care Class

4-Hers must complete Quality Assurance Training to exhibit or auction beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, meat goats, dairy goats, poultry and rabbits. This is an annual program that must be completed. 4-H members may also complete the online \$12 Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program. The website is https://yqcaprogram.org. 4-H members must be certified through the inperson Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training or the online YQCA program by July 11th.

INDIANA 4-H QUALITY LIVESTOCK CARE & PARENT MEETING

To exhibit BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, POULTRY, and RABBITS, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA).

- 1. This certification must be done an annual basis
- 2. Members must be registered BEFORE attending a training
- 3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer OR a training in another county

OR complete the online YQCA training (Proof of YQCA completion must be submitted to the Extension Office by July 11!)





4-H Scholarships

All 4-H members who are currently in grades 10-12 are eligible to apply for Indiana 4-H Scholarships sponsored by the Indiana 4-H Foundation. Ripley County 4-H members who apply for the state Senior Year Scholarship or Accomplishment Scholarship will automatically be submitted for the six county scholarships as well. Information about Scholarships can be found on the <u>State 4-H Scholarship Web Page</u> or by contacting the Extension Office.

Scholarships are due January 25, 2026!

4-H Scholarship Help Sessions:

Help Sessions are drop in office hour style, stop in to ask questions, get help editing and polishing your scholarship, or whatever you may need. Bring a laptop and your green 4-H record book with you to help during the help session.



Senior Year Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in their senior year of high school

Club Scholarship

Available to 4-H members entering Purdue University majoring in the College of Agriculture or select majors in the College of Health and Human Sciences

Purdue Horticulture & Landscape Architecture Scholarship

Available to a 4-H member majoring in horticulture or landscape architecture at Purdue University and studied plant science in 4-H.

Accomplishment Scholarship

Available to 4-H members in grades 10-12 of high school and the year immediately following high school graduation. The purpose of the 4-H Accomplishment Scholarship is to recognize youth who have excelled in life skills development through their 4-H activities and involvement.

Categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science. Three additional categories are reserved for applicants demonstrating life skills development in more than one of the previously listed categories. Those are Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership.

Eligibility: Applicants must be in grade 10, 11, 12, or their first year immediately following 4-H enrollment eligibility at the time applications are due. While an applicant does not have to be a current 4-H member, they must demonstrate multiple years of involvement in Indiana's 4-H Youth Development Program.

Youth who have previously been awarded a \$1,000 accomplishment scholarship are only eligible to compete in the Premier Achievement, Premier Citizenship, and Premier Leadership categories. Youth who have previously been awarded a \$2,000 scholarship are no longer eligible to compete in any category.

Awards: A minimum of thirty \$1,000 scholarships will be awarded to youth based on their demonstration of life skills development in these eight categories: Animal Science—Meat and Milk Production; Animal Science—Companion and Small Animal Production; Citizenship; Communications; Engineering and Technological Science; Healthy Living, Food, and Nutrition Science; Leadership Development; and Plant and Environmental Science.

A minimum of one \$2,000 scholarship will be awarded in each of these categories: Premier Achievement; Premier Citizenship; and Premier Leadership.

FOREST MANAGEMENT FOR THE PRIVATE WOODLAND OWNER T

Workshop Information

Forests cover nearly 20% of Indiana, and approximately 85% is in private ownerships like farms and families. Less than 20% of those owners have a forest management plan to guide them in the sustainable management of their property. Forests provide multiple ecologic, economic, and societal benefits, but may not be realizing their potential due to poor or no management activity, and threats like invasive plant species and pests. Indiana forests also support an important forest products industry, employing thousands of people and supporting many rural communities. Private forestland owners are often unaware of the resources and assistance available to them for realizing their property management goals. Forest Management for the Private Woodland Owner provides 8 evening indoor sessions and 1 field tour providing information on the biology and management of Indiana woodlands. Instruction is provided by Purdue Extension specialists and natural resource professionals. Sponsored by Purdue Forestry and Natural Resources Extension and Indiana DNR Division of Forestry.
