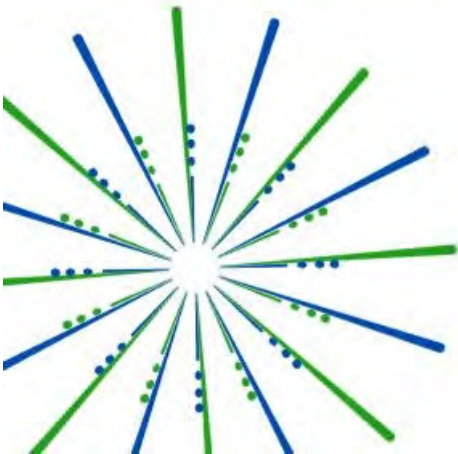
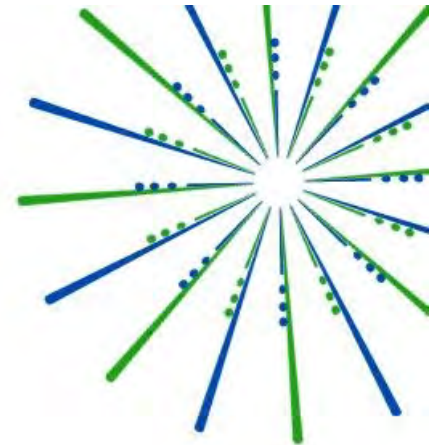

4-H Livestock 2024 Information Sheet

Important Dates for your calendar

- **May 15th** Drop and add projects in 4Honline and make sure your animals ID tag information is entered in 4Honline by this day.
- **June 1st** you must have your animals' classes picked and entered into Fairentry.com. *This year you must enter your animals in the bred and owned class in fair entry if they are eligible.*
- **June 10th** Complete Livestock Quality Care training and pay auction fees (if applicable) by this day.

ID DAYS

Beef ID- Saturday, March 9 @ Little York Stockyards 8:30-10:30 am

- ❖ Beef tags cost \$6 each

Sheep, Goat and Swine ID- Wednesday May 1st from 5-7 pm @ the fairgrounds

- ❖ Swine tags are \$4, Sheep and Goat tags are \$2

Small Animal ID (tattoos for rabbits and NPIP for poultry) June 15th. 8 am- 10 am Rabbits and 10am-12 pm Poultry

- ❖ Rabbit tattooing is \$2.00 and poultry testing is \$2.00.

NO TAGS CAN BE PURCHASED PRIOR TO ID DAY

TO EXHIBIT: The animal must have attended their species ID Day, have their information entered into 4HOnline and registered for classes in Fair Entry. Additionally, youth must have taken a Livestock Quality Care class with the 4-H Educator. At least two will be provided before the June 10th deadline.

The only animals that do not have to do the Livestock Quality Care are llamas, alpacas, horses, dogs and cats.

TO SELL: Youth must have exhibited their animal at the fair and have attended an additional learning event* (different from livestock quality care). Youth must pay auction fees by June 10th and visit at least one local business to invite them to the auction.

Additionally, we will have some opportunities to learn more about the Livestock Auction this spring. We will send information out about those meetings as they draw near.

**Learning events will be promoted in the newsletter.*

The 2024 auction will be premium only.
