4-H ENROLLMENT

- The Indiana 4-H program will open for enrollments on October 1, 2025, please enroll by January 15th. Enrollments submitted after January 15th are subject to delay.
- To re-enroll, go to the website v2.4honline.com. Please read all the questions carefully, as 4-H Online has been updated!
- Current 4-H and Mini 4-H members must use the email and password that were used to create your family profile. If you cannot remember your email, contact our office for help.
- All 4-H members must enroll as "Youth," even if they are close to turning 18.
- Do NOT create a new Family Profile! Making a new profile will slow down your enrollment. We will have to delete the second profile, and then you will need to re-enroll under your original profile.
- If you need to add a family member to 4-H Online, add them to your current Family Profile. Again, do NOT create a new Family Profile!
- If you have moved recently, update your address in your family account under 'Member List' and in each individual profile. If the address is different in both places, you might miss important information!
- ALL 4-H members, Mini 4-H members, and Adult Volunteers MUST re-enroll each year!

4-H FOR NEXT YEAR

- 4-H Enrollment for the 2025-2026 program year will begin October 1st!
- Please remember to use the same login information as in previous years! Creating a new account will slow down the approval process.
- As always, our 4-H staff are available to assist with any enrollment questions or concerns.
- All members, Mini 4-H members, and adult volunteers must re-enroll for each program year. If you are a new volunteer (who was a senior 4-H member last year), please log in using your existing profile and apply. Once your enrollment is complete, we can separate your profile from your family's.

SHOOTING SPORTS

- Orientation meeting will be held on December 2, 2025 beginning at 7:00 PM in the Brinson Building at the Shelby County Fairgrounds.
- This is the meeting to attend if you are interested in joining shooting sports.
- Shelby County 4-H Shooting Sports is a club with the goal of teaching the safe use, understanding and handling of archery equipment as well as firearms. This is taught interactively by 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinators and instructors at a private range in Shelby County. The 4-H member will be expected to be familiar with the range rules, the parts of the equipment they are using as well as how all those parts work together.

JUNIOR LEADERS

What is Junior Leaders?

- Shelby County 4-H Junior Leaders is a club as well as a project open to all youth in grades 7-12. They participate in various leadership and community service projects throughout the year. There is no additional charge for 4-H Junior Leader membership, but you must re-enroll in it every year.
- The Junior Leaders will be conducting two fundraisers this fall at the same time. Members will be selling the following items: fudge from The Mill Fudge Factory and food gift baskets (nuts, sweet treats, meat sticks, etc.) from Christian Kropf. LIVESTOCK & ANIMAL EXHIBITORS

- PLANNING AHEAD: keep in mind enrollment of 4-H animals will again be done through the 4-H Online website. The deadline is May 15. All lease forms, auction forms and pen reservations are due May 15 to the Extension Office as well! Digital versions of these forms can be found on our website under 'Shelby County Forms'.
 - Animal Ownership Policy: "Dairy cows (as long as the animal is being shown by same 4-Her from 2020 and forward) and heifers, horses, ponies, alpacas and llamas may be leased, subject to approval of both the county 4-H dairy, horse and pony or llama committee and the respective County Extension Educator. 4-H animals (horse and pony, dairy, alpacas and llamas) are only eligible to be leased by a single 4-H member in a 4-H program year. COUNTY ONLY All other species may be leased, but not shown at the state fair, subject to approval of the livestock superintendents. These leased animals are not eligible to sell in the Livestock Auction. The lease agreement forms are due in the Shelby County Extension Office by May 15th." page 177 of 2025 Shelby County Handbook.
- This enrollment allows the animal to be identified as an official 4-H animal that can
 exhibit at our county show, 4-H fun shows, area shows and the Indiana State Fair. The
 following species must enroll by May 15th through v2.4honline.com
 - Horse & Pony
 - Cattle (beef & dairy)
 - Goats
 - Llamas
 - o Sheep
 - Swine
- All animal lease forms must be turned in to the Extension Office by May 15!
- Poultry Workshop November 3, 2025 in the Brinson Building from 5:00 7:00 PM.
 Topics to be covered: Introduction to the project, rules, Selecting your birds, The Standard of Perfection, feed, and care.

IQLC

To exhibit BEEF CATTLE, DAIRY CATTLE, SWINE, SHEEP, MEAT GOATS, DAIRY GOATS, POULTRY, and RABBITS, 4-H members must be certified through the Indiana 4-H Quality Livestock Care training OR the online Youth for the Quality Care of Animals program (YQCA). Must be an approved member to sign up for IQLC.

- 1. This certification must be done on an annual basis
- 2.Members must be approved and registered for this event in 4-HOnline **BEFORE** attending the training
- 3. Members may attend any training dates listed on this flyer
 - a. OR a training in another county
 - b.OR complete the online YQCA training

CHANGES FOR 2026

This is a highlight of changes that you will see in the 2026 Handbook.

- The following County projects will no longer be offered: Barbeque, Bicycle Rodeo, Bicycle Poster, H.E.L.P., and Weeds Identification.
- Members will be permitted to exhibit two (2) Recycling projects, but each exhibit must be from a different category.
- There will be two (2) Club projects offered this year: Club Banner and Club Scrapbook. More details to come.
- Animal project superintendents will be serving terms with limits and moving to a Co-Superintendent format. All superintendents are aware of these changes.
- Royal Showmanship is moving to a new format where competitors will compete in the Royal the same year they earn their spot. As we transition to this format in 2026, there will be two separate competitions at the 2026 Fair. The 2025 Fair winners will compete at the beginning of the week, and the 2026 Fair winners will compete at the end of the week. More details will be announced closer to the fair.
- There are some species-specific rules that have been added/revised and we encourage you to reach out to project leaders as practices start next year to make sure you understand any changes. All changes will be printed and available prior to those events taking place. If you have specific concerns, please reach out to our 4-H Educator, Erin Padgett.

4-H VOLUNTEERS

Changes for this year (4-H Online)

- Simplified training for returning volunteers, online trainings are dependent on rotation
- Volunteers, please re-enroll by January 15, 2026. This process needs to be completed sooner rather than later!
 - All 4-H Volunteers must be in 'Approved' status prior to assuming volunteer duties with 4-H (including meeting and working with youth and making decisions for 4-H)
- Clubs that do not complete the necessary (annual) financial management forms are at risk of their club bring dissolved the following year.
 - o There is a 'Volunteer Update' packet that is typically mailed in November.
 - The 'Club Information Form' was due on September 26. This is an annual form that must be completed.
- As a reminder, Only approved volunteers in 4-H Online may assume volunteer duties on behalf of the Purdue Extension 4-H Youth Development Program including working with youth, fundraising or making decisions for 4-H.
- Tips for a successful enrollment:
 - Select the volunteer type and role communicated by the 4-H Educator. Incorrectly selecting a role will require more work for you and your county 4-H Educator. Enrollments submitted with the incorrect roles will be sent back for correction.
 - Use a computer rather than a phone or tablet if possible
 - Once you submit a step (enrollment or screening), wait for the next step before exiting.
 - o Give yourself ample time to complete
 - You can start the process and return to it if you cannot complete it in one sitting, but if you allot 15 minutes, you should be able to get through the enrollment and screening process no problem. If you have a training to complete, you will want to add at least 30-45 minutes to that time frame.
 - Complete your enrollment at least 30 days prior to when you intend to start volunteering
 - This should provide ample time for your enrollment to be reviewed and the internal steps (registry check, reference check for new volunteers, etc.) to be completed by the 4-H Educator.



Did you know we welcomed nineteen new volunteers in 2025? This growth is exponential. We are thrilled to welcome new leaders and volunteers! You all are the reason our program continues to grow—thank you!
