4-H ROUND-UP (Grades 7-9)

June 26-28. Transportation provided. This 3-day conference of 4-H members from around the state is held at Purdue University. The program is developed to inspire youth to continue in 4-H and to provide valuable career information. Participants have the opportunity to experience a large university campus and learn about career opportunities.

STATE 4-H JUNIOR LEADER CONFERENCE

June 13-16. Junior Leaders grades 9-12. No transportation provided. This conference is held at DePauw University. The conference focus is on leadership development, understanding group dynamics, and gaining ideas for Jr. Leader organizations. It's also a great opportunity to meet new people from across the state.

STATE 4-H BAND

June 24-26. Grades 9-12. No transportation provided. This trip is for youth who want to learn more about instrumental performance, techniques, and perform in Loeb Playhouse on Purdue campus. Youth will improve their instrumental skills as they prepare for a concert band performance during 4-H Round-Up. An additional state application form must be completed by the 4-H member in April.

CITIZENSHIP WASHINGTON FOCUS

Dates 7/1-7/7. Grades: 9 - 12 (age 15 by June 15th) Exciting experience for 4-H members to go to the nation's capital and learn about the meaning of citizenship. Young people acquire increased motivation and skills for dealing with contemporary social issues and for taking leadership in community development, government affairs, and related projects.

STATE 4-H CHORUS

June 24-26. No transportation provided. Open to any 8th-12th grade student who wants to participate in an intensive, dynamic, challenging, and fun-filled singing, dancing and performance-orientated workshop. You will make new friends and work with some of the best music and performance teachers and staff in Indiana. An additional state application form must be completed by April.

4-H Academy

June 7-9. Transportation provided. Grades: 9-12. Designed to offer hands-on opportunities to learn about a diverse selection of subjects and careers. Participants will meet and learn from professors and other experts in their respective fields and participate in interactive activities and experiential learning. Workshop topics are still being finalized so changes to final topic offerings may occur.

Animal Science: Learn scientific principles of Animal Sciences, increase awareness of animal industry issues and learn about career opportunities in animal agriculture. Select one from the following:

- Animal Bio-Science
- Animal Health
- Food Animal 1 (beef, dairy, sheep, and goat)
- Food Animal 2 (swine, poultry, and rabbit)
- Horse and Companion Animal (horse, dog, cat, llama, and zoo animals)

Citizenship in 4-H: Start Local...Go Global: How do local and state governments work? How can I impact issues that are important to me? What international opportunities are available through 4-H and beyond? Learn answers to these and others questions in the 4-H Citizenship Workshop.

Entrepreneurship: Do you have a business or product idea but aren't sure how to get started? This workshop will help you make connections to introduce you to the world of entrepreneurship. Spend 3 days at Purdue interacting with world-class faculty and staff while you develop and plan the next great Indiana business!

Food Science: Learn about the science and nutrition of food from "farm to fork"! Participants will explore several aspects of food production, processing, preparation, and consumption. Learn where our food comes from, how to reduce food waste, and preparation techniques for local produce

Healthy Living:

- Exploring Health Careers: Students experience field trips and hands-on activities related to nursing, emergency medical services, athletic training, and more. Students will also become CPR certified.
- Intro to Emergency Medical Services: Students become CPR certified and learn through hands-on activities: scene size-up, patient assessment, rescue techniques, scene preservation, radio procedures and tours of fire stations, emergency helicopters, and Mobile Simulation Ambulances.

Natural Resources: Learn about forestry and wildlife management through hands-on activities on location at the Purdue Forestry Center. Students will also learn about the many natural resources career opportunities.

Plant Science: Learn about plants, insects, bioenergy and natural resources.

Show Me the Money: Learn the essentials of financial management from the best network of financial professionals in the state. Experience a full day of Where Does Your Money Go® adventures at vendor locations in Lafayette. Learn new tools to make financial goals a reality!

Spread the News: Do you like to be the first to share important news and information with others? Do you like to be creative and write, draw, or shoot photographs? Are you interested in a career in communication or journalism? If so, this workshop might be for you. Participants will use computers and cameras to develop news stories and photos for print and social media while exploring the vast array of careers.

STEM It Up: Learn about new and exciting STEM careers and related real-world applications. Delegates will see the role technology plays in their lives, while also exposing them to the many education and career opportunities with fun hands-on activities and much more. Tracks:

- Computer Science
- Engineering
- Robotics
- The Science of Flight
- Electric: Powering Your World

Sustainable Agriculture: This workshop is designed to engage and educate high school youth regarding sustainable practices in crop production. Participants will learn through hands-on activities and field encounters lead by expert Purdue faculty, staff, graduate students and industrial leaders. Participants will have the opportunity to experience the research being conducted at Purdue University and in industries that address global food security, reduction of environmental impact, and sustained economic and social standings.
