

4-H Faceoff

The Steuben County 4-H Jr. Leaders will be hosting their 10th Annual 4-H Faceoff at the 4-H Fair this year! The Jr. Leaders invite you to create a team of 4-H'ers willing to get messy and laugh a lot on Monday, July 18th at 6 pm in the Grandstands. Tami and Morgan, our 4-H Summer Program Assistant, are planning some fun challenges to spice up the night and provide some quality entertainment for 4-H families and the community.

Here are the guidelines:

- 4-H members only; 6 members per team
- At least 1 member must be of the opposite gender
- At least 1 member must have just completed grades 3-5 AND at least 1 member must have just completed grades 6-12
- Teams are encouraged to create a unique team name and dress alike
- Registrations are available at the Extension Office or online at bit.ly/4hlanding page. We are trying to recover some of the costs incurred for the supplies, so each member is asked to pay \$2, making it \$12/team. All signatures must be included!

Gate Passes and Admission

To enter the 4-H Fair, everyone will need a gate pass. Weekly gate passes can be moved from vehicle to vehicle, will be for sale in late June, and cost \$10. On July 15th, the price jumps to \$15. If you only plan to visit one day, daily passes are \$5 and can be purchased during the fair. **Event admission prices are:** Single Adult Ticket-\$15 or 2 Adult Tickets for \$25; Single Pit Pass Ticket-\$20 or 2 Pit Pass Tickets for \$35; Youth Ticket (ages 5-12)-\$5

Event Center Hosts

If you have two hours (or more!) to spare during the fair, please let us know! We are looking for individuals who are willing to serve as hosts in the Event Center. It's an easy task...you simply watch over the exhibits in the air-conditioned building. You can socialize with folks or bring a book to read. Your presence is all we're really seeking! WHAT GRADE AM I IN???

When you complete record sheets, complete FairEntry, and fill out your project exhibit labels, please use the grade you were in when you enrolled in 4-H. We know you're excited to advance to the next grade in school, now that this past year is behind you (or nearly behind you), but for 4-H, please use the grade you were in most of this year.

Clean Stalls and Litter-Free Fairgrounds

Looking for something to do or someone to hang out with? Join the Fair Board, Project Superintendents, and myself on **Saturday, July 9th and Friday, July 22nd** to help clean-up the fairgrounds. I realize it doesn't sound overly exciting, but it is a great way to spend time with folks preparing for or reminiscing about the 4-H Fair, and it is a great way to give back to the community. If you want a clean barn or your projects to be displayed on a clean surface, you might as well help make it happen! Visit the new Fair Office where a list of tasks to be completed will be hanging up. Let's work together to cross them off the list! **Hoping to see you there at 8:00 am!**

Wish List at the County Park

If your 4-H club or even your family can spare some time, there are few things that can be accomplished at the County Park before the fair:

Large Exhibits

If your really large exhibit earns the honor of representing Steuben County 4-H at the Indiana State Fair, please remember that you will need to connect with the Extension Office. Tami fills a minivan with State Fair projects, so large exhibits usually do not fit. If you have a large exhibit, you will be asked to transport it to and from Indianapolis if you wish for it to be displayed at the Indiana State Fair. This usually effects Home Environment, Woodworking, and Crafts.

Superintendent Checklists

Project Superintendents, we emailed and postal mailed checklists to you to guide you as we prepare for the fair. Here are a few highlights:

- ⇒ Please pick up record sheets July 1st around noon or after.
- ⇒ Please return graded record sheets on July 7th or before.
- ⇒ Help with clean-up on July 9th, if possible. Livestock Supers may want to hang pen cards that day. First preference in some barns is given to the youth who help with clean-up.
- ⇒ Non-animal Supers, please plan to help with judging on July 14th. You will record the ribbon grades and place items on the appropriate exhibits.
- ⇒ Livestock Supers, visit the Fair Office prior to 8 am on check-in day. We'll give you instructions and get you started for a great week! Be sure to check back a day or so after to break large classes.
- ⇒ We need everyone's help dumping trash during the week, especially around the barns. If you see a full trash can, please lend a hand but taking it to the dumpster. Livestock Supers, you will also need to check the manure spreaders regularly to avoid over-filling. Thanks for helping with these two dirty jobs!
- ⇒ Please either help with Event Center Clean-Up or help get your animal exhibitors lined up for the auction. Both are super helpful ways to volunteer!
- ⇒ We would really appreciate your help at Post-fair Clean-up on Friday, July 22nd!

Opening Ceremonies Info

This year's Opening Ceremony is on Friday, July 15. All 8-year, 9-year, 10-year, and final year members; scholarship winners; and Achievement Winner applicants will be listed in a paper program that will be available for all in attendance. We will recognize and ask that all 10-year members, final year members, scholarship winners, and Achievement Winner applicants be present and well dressed on July 15. Please meet behind the Rensch Hall stage at 5:15 pm that evening. This means that all 8-year and 9-year members do not need to be present, but your names will be announced. We will still order your awards, and they will be available for pick-up.

Open Judging

In Steuben County, we practice open judging which basically means you, as a 4-H member, have the opportunity to have an open conversation with the judge of your static (non-animal) project. It is a great learning experience in which you can ask questions and obtain constructive criticism and genuine praise regarding your project and your efforts. Parents/guardians are not permitted to speak with the judges during open judging as it is a prime time for youth to shine on their very own, explaining what they learned and how they accomplished their goals.

Event Center Exhibit Check-In Procedures

All youth will check in their exhibits by last name. Upon arrival, all youth will need to check-in at the front tables, located on the north side of the Steuben County Event Center. A volunteer will verify which

projects you brought to exhibit and will direct you to the appropriate location where your exhibits will be displayed. We will have extra exhibit labels/name cards available for you to fill out and tape to your exhibit. Photography judging will be taking place at this time, so we ask that you be mindful and respectful of the noise level. If you didn't complete FairEntry, this process will take longer for you as you'll have to visit the 'Help Table' to get everything registered.



Tentative Judging Schedule

The schedule below will serve as the tentative judging schedule for static (non-animal) exhibits. In effort to save travel time for judges, we often "double-stack" judges, meaning they may be paid by the 4-H Fair Board to judge one project at 9 am and another at noon or perhaps they are hired to judge two smaller projects in the same time slot such as Garden and Floriculture at 9 am. Please be patient with the judges as they work through multiple exhibits and projects. Project Superintendents will do their best to make sure you have a chance to talk to the judge, if you are present on judging day. Just be sure to let your Superintendent know you are around!

- O Relay information
- O Have one main idea or message
- Attract attention
- O Be self-explanatory
- O Have an art form
- O Be 22"x28", displayed horizontally
- O Have a stiff backing
- O Have an exhibit label in the lower, right corner

Plan for Exhibit Labels

Each static (non-animal) exhibit will need a label identifying who it belongs to. Exhibit labels are 2.8" wide and 5.5" tall and must be displayed vertically. We have some in the office, or you can pick them up at project check-in, just before the fair. Please plan for label space, especially if you are exhibiting a poster project.

Important Info for Posters, Notebooks, and Display Boards

All posters, notebooks, and display boards must include a reference list indicating where information was obtained, giving credit to the original author, to complete the 4-H member's exhibit. This reference list should/might include web site links, people and professionals interviewed, books, magazines, etc. It is recommended this reference list be attached to the back of a poster or display board, be the last page of a notebook, or included as part of the display visible to the public. A judge is not to discredit an exhibit for the manner in which references are listed.



Earn Livestock Prizes!

Youth in grades 3-12 can participate in the Steuben County 4-H Livestock Skill-a-thon on Wednesday, July 20th at 11 am in Rensch Hall. This opportunity is for all youth, not just those who physically exhibit livestock species. Youth can compete in one species category, two, or all six (Beef/Cattle, Dairy, Goats, Horse, Sheep, and Swine)! The contest is divided by divisions—Junior (gardes 3-5), Intermediate (grades 6-8, and Senior (grades 9-12). Knowledge challenges include equipment/tack, feed types, breeds, meat cuts, and general knowledge. Last year's prizes included banners, buckets, and other livestock-related items!

Please sign up via FairEntry! Walk-ups are welcome, too, but FairEntry will help us with printing.

Livestock Auction Cards

Invite buyers to the 4-H auction with pre-printed auction postcards, available at the Extension Office. You can simply sign the cards provided and mail them to potential buyers. A more personal touch would involve writing your own letter and personally delivering the letter to the buyer.

2022 Market Prices

Market prices have not been fabulous the last several years, and you can probably expect the same in 2022. Market trucks are simply a service provided so that you do not have to market your animals on your own. You are not required to utilize the market truck whatsoever, but you must understand that all animals with a block sale price that go through the auction are expected to load on the market truck as those animals have technically been "marketed." If you wish for higher prices, we encourage you to help your superintendent locate a higher paying market. Rather than complaining about low market prices, be part of the solution to help secure reasonable prices.

Need Auction Tips?

If you want help navigating the 4-H auction, please reference your June 2022 Clover Connection. There was a section explaining how the auction works, and it offered helpful tips for obtaining buyers. You may also call an Auction Committee member for assistance as they are more than willing to help!

Auction checks will be available 30 days after the auction (August 21, 2022). If you wish to send your thank you notes directly after the fair in order to be more timely with your gratitude, you are invited to call our office to find out who bought your animals. It's a good idea to write thank you's while you are still in fair mode.

ISF Entry and Grooming

The 2022 Indiana State Fair Entry Book has been posted at www.indianastatefair.com/p/state-fair Be sure to check it out if you plan to exhibit animals at the State Fair! Grooming Assistance applications are now available on the Indiana 4-H Animal Science page.

Your well-being and your animals' well-being are important!

If the weather during our fair is typical, we'll be covered in heat waves. Please be sure to properly care for yourself and your animals. Be sure to have fresh water on hand, and think of ways to keep your animals cool. Because most animals are auctioned or consigned, you should also be familiar with medication withdrawal times to insure a safe food product for consumers. While you may be aiming for a certain weight for your animal, please don't overfeed or underfeed it just to achieve your goal. A healthy animal will be more appealing to a judge any day! You need to treat your animals in a humans ways and many times that

mane way, and many times that simply means having patience instead of forcefully making your animals go where you want them to go.





