Club Activity: Ag Innovators Experience



Avian Influenza

Indiana has a large presence in the commercial poultry industry. Currently, there are 5 cases of H5N1 Avian Influenza in commercial turkey farms in Southern Indiana. Avian Influenza is a respiratory virus that infects chickens and ducks and causes high mortality.

The best way to protect your poultry is to practice good biosecurity and limit the movement of your birds. Currently, there are no restrictions on county poultry projects, but we encourage limiting use of live birds in workshops and other activities. Our efforts help protect not only your own birds, but the poultry industry as a whole.

Workshops as Record Sheet Replacement

At the November 4-H Fair Board meeting, we received approval to extend the "record sheet replacement" workshop options beyond the livestock projects. Now all projects are eligible for record sheet replacement as long as the workshop is approved by the Extension Office. Workshops should be at least 60-90 minutes, have a hands-on component, and cover practical educational concepts related to the project. Workshops on the schedule include:

- Swine: Jr. Pork Day, Saturday, March 26th, 9 am-3 pm, Purdue University; \$5 per person
- **Cat**: Small Animal Discovery Day, April 9th, 9 am-4 pm, Noble County Fairgrounds, \$5
- **Dog**: Small Animal Discovery Day, April 9th, 9 am-4 pm, Noble County Fairgrounds, \$5
- **Rabbit**: Small Animal Discovery Day, April 9th, 9 am-4 pm, Noble County Fairgrounds, \$5
- **Poultry**: Small Animal Discovery Day, April 9th, 9 am-4 pm, Noble County Fairgrounds, \$5
- **Poultry**: Saturday, May 14, 10-11:30 am, Poultry/Rabbit Barn
- **Rabbit**: Saturday, May 14, 12-1:30 pm, Poultry/Rabbit Barn

Premise ID

New to 4-H? If so, you may need a premise ID. All properties that house certain livestock species are **required** by state law to have a premise ID. Premise IDs are confidential and no one can look them up. They are a seven digit, alpha-numeric ID and usually begin with 00. If you have one and lost it, email animalid@boah.in.gov. Members with cattle, swine, sheep, and goats **must** have a premise ID. It is now **strongly recommended** by BOAH that those with equine and poultry also get a premise ID. Exhibitors with equine and poultry at the Indiana State Fair may be asked to present a premise ID.

- This number is assigned to a farm location almost like an address. If your farm does not have one, please call the Indiana Board of Animal Health at 317-544-2381 or visit www.in.gov/boah
- If you house your animals at another location, check with the property owner for the premise ID.
- Premise ID's are needed for cattle, swine, sheep, and goat animal identification in 4HOnline.

YQCA Certification Required Annually for Livestock Exhibitors

To exhibit beef cattle, dairy cattle, swine, sheep, goats, poultry, and rabbits (so, basically everything except for horses, cats, and dogs), 4-H members must be certified through "Youth for the Quality Care of Animals." This is an <u>annual</u> certification that must be completed via online modules <u>or</u> in-person trainings. These in-person certifications are held to share the message of proper animal care prior to or around the time that some of you acquire animals. We want you to have the proper knowledge and skills as your live-stock season kicks off! The YQCA trainings listed below will be offered in Steuben County. Please register in advance.

- Tuesday, April 5, 9-10:30 am, Board Room (during Prairie Heights' Spring Break)
- Tuesday, April 12, 5:30-7 pm, Board Room
- Monday, May 2, 5:30-7 pm, Board Room

If you are unable to take the certification course in Steuben County and do not wish to take the training online, you may attend in any county. Dates for trainings outside of the county can be viewed (after March 28th) at https://yqcaprogram.org. You will sign-up for the workshop of your choice and pay online. <u>In-person workshops require online registration of \$3, and online workshops require online registration of \$12. Either way, you need to go online to register and pay.</u>

YQCA Change and Update!

Life wouldn't be interesting without changes, right?! Although unexpected, we need to share that YQCA is changing online platforms on March 23rd, and as a result, everyone who registers in the current system will be lost. I deleted the other trainings and capped the class that currently has kids in it because I need to get those 3 kids out of the class before March 22nd.

For those already certified this year: While this does not alter the certification you received by attending the YQCA class, it may affect you, if you need a YQCA printed certificate. Some open shows may ask for it, and it will be required for entry at the Indiana State Fair. If you have any inkling that you may show somewhere OTHER THAN the Steuben County 4-H Fair, please log in to yqca.learngrow.io no later than March 22nd to save or print a copy of your certificate. You will NOT need a copy to enter at the Steuben County 4-H Fair. I know who I have seen in class, I keep a list, and everything local is good to go locally. This is only pressing for larger shows, and especially the Indiana State Fair.

For those not yet certified: All of the dates I have posted are still on. We just can't register anyone in the old (current) system. So for now, please keep the date on your calendar and plan to attend. I will be taking the week of Spring Break off (when all of transition happens), so after I return to the office, I will add the April and May classes. At that point, you will be able to once again register online.

Most important thing: Let's roll with it together, and we'll make sure everyone is good in shape before July!



4HOnline is a statewide system in which the information transfers to the Indiana State Fair. If you plan to exhibit at the county level only, you will still see fields in 4HOnline that say "required." County-only participants may type the equivalent number of zeros in the fields that do not apply to them (ie. RFID field would need 15 zeros). If you plan to exhibit at the Indiana State Fair, complete every field with the appropriate requirement.
