Delegates choose an important societal topic and in round table groups prepare a briefing. During the conference, groups present their briefing to federal officials. 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4-H Committees for Youth & Adults

The 4-H program relies on 4-H volunteers to help carry out the Indiana 4-H Youth Development Program. In Steuben County, there are 10 committees that stem from the 4-H Fair Board. You do NOT have to be a Fair Board Member to serve on a committee! Email or call Tami to join one!

ANNOUNCERS—Help create a consistent announcing presence at 4-H livestock shows. Be willing to announce show classes with a confident voice at the fair.

ANNUAL FUNDRAISER—Help choose products and develop the packet for annual fundraiser. Be willing to help with fundraiser item drop off and pick up. Meets approximately 1-2 times a year.

AUCTION—Review the past auction, decide if any changes need to be made, and plan the future auction. Distribute advertisement and assist in performing the auction. Become familiar with the software used for the auction. Meets 1-2 times during the year to plan, during the 4-H Fair, and at least once a few days after the 4-H Fair to enter add-ons, clean computers, print bills, and mail receipts.

AWARDS—Select recipients of 4-H awards and delegates for 4-H trips. Select trophies and special awards and help secure trophy sponsors, if needed. Meets approximately 2-3 times during the year; many items are handled via email. CAMPING—Help facilitate camping at the 4-H Fair. Setup camping spaces. Work on future plans for camping at the 4-H Fair. Meets a couple times near fair time. FINANCE—Develop a funding structure, determine potential donors, and coordinate appropriate communication to/from donors. Consult with memorial fund donors on their funding wishes. Create and maintain

GROUNDS—Ensure the fairgrounds are in tip-top shape before, during, and after the fair. Attend designated work days to help with various items (painting, raking, repairing bleachers, picking rocks, etc.). Help secure trash removal during and after the 4-H Fair. Secure restroom-cleaners for the week of the 4-H Fair. Move bleachers to the appropriate areas. May meet once, with work being done at various times.

PARKING & GATE—Contact volunteers/organizations to work the entrance gates the week of the 4-H Fair and assist with the parking of vehicles during the large entertainment events. Collect and count funds each day during the fair. May meet once, with everyone assisting with parking during the 4-H Fair.

PORK STAND—Help establish the pork stand as a fundraiser during the 4-H fair for barns and clubs. Develop plans for improvements. Assist with getting stand staffed and supplied. Meets 1-2 times during the off-season, with lots of help needed fair week.

PROGRAMS & PUBLICITY—Establish the activities/programs for the 4-H Fair, including Family Fun Day, evening entertainment, and any other activities that might attract crowds and/or be of public interest. Be present during fair week to assist with the activities/programs. Decide how to advertise the 4-H Fair and accompanying events (billboards, yard signs, radio, newspapers, parades, etc.). Members will make the proper advertisement contacts and distribute the promotional materials when the time arrives. Meets approximately 4-5 times.



Communicating with Us:

Please note: while we use social media to share what's happening in our program for advertisement and promotion, it would be best to call or email us with project or program specific questions. Social media is not the best mode for communicating guidelines and answering more complex questions. Although Facebook Messenger and Instagram Chats are one-click-wonders, please don't use them as primary communication with us. We don't check them near as regularly as our phones and email inboxes.

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Help Needed!

While many volunteers stay with us for years, when a volunteer signs on, they are only making a one year commitment that can be renewed or declined each year. Some volunteers don't even volunteer for a year...they volunteer in an "episodic" role where they help with a one-time project or a few weeks max. The volunteer year aligns with the youth program year, so each fall/winter, we ask volunteers to re-enroll in 4-H. If you haven't given 4-H volunteerism a try, consider these opportunities below. If after a year (or your episodic experience), you decide the role isn't for you, that's okay!
