

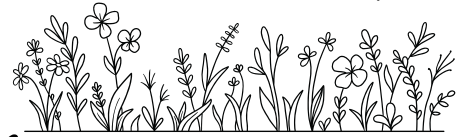

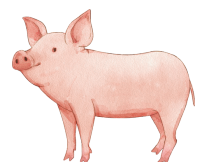

Gate Passes and Admission

To enter the 4-H Fair, everyone will need a gate pass. Weekly gate passes can be moved from vehicle to vehicle, will be for sale in late May, and cost \$10. On June 20th, the price jumps to \$15. If you only plan to visit one day, daily passes are \$5 and can be purchased during the fair. Online pre-sale truck pull and rodeo tickets are being looked into for a discounted price if purchased by June 19. On site tickets will be \$20 individuals age 13 and up, kids 6-12 at \$10, kids age 5 and under free. No refunds.

4HOnline Animal ID Quirks

Animal ID is due May 15th. Please check the animal ID chart provided in this newsletter so that you know exactly what information is needed and where it goes. A few quirks with the system include:

- Dairy Beef Cross Feeder Calves will go under “Dairy Feeders” in 4HOnline Animal ID. Choose “Crossbreed - County ONLY” for the breed.
- If there is a required field for RFID but your animal doesn’t have an RFID tag, simply enter 15 zeros (000000000000000).
- Pigs aren’t tattooed, and we know that, but when the prompt first pops up for Swine Barrows and Swine Gilts, it will ask for a tattoo. Enter your ear notches here. If you don’t have ear notches, enter the 5-digit county tag (76XXX). State Fair pigs MUST have ear notches.
- As a reminder, nothing is entered in 4HOnline for Rabbits, Poultry, Dog, or Cat at this time.

Open Judging

Parents/guardians are not permitted to speak with the judges during open judging as it is a prime time for youth to shine on their very own, explaining what they learned and how they accomplished their goals.

- Have one main idea or message
- Attract attention
- Be self-explanatory
- Have an art form
- Be 22"x28", displayed horizontally
- Have a stiff backing
- Have an exhibit label in the lower, right corner

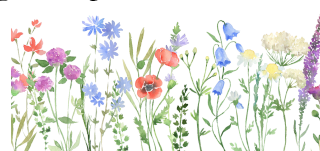

4-H Exhibition vs. Completion

Did you know that exhibiting 4-H projects at the fair is optional and a privilege? 4-H members are not required to exhibit their projects. If you wanted, you could simply complete your record sheets which focus on the educational aspect of your project area and show proof of an exhibit. However, much of our enjoyment comes from exhibiting and having our projects judged. It is the icing on the cake, so to speak. Why do we even bring it up, you may ask... Unfortunately, several members have lost animals due to health issues or have a valuable item they do not wish to display. Hopefully you will all try your very best to exhibit and show the public how talented you are!

Plan for Exhibit Labels

Each static (non-animal) exhibit will need a label identifying who it belongs to. Exhibit labels are 2.8” wide and 5.5” tall and must be displayed vertically. We have some in the office, or you can pick them up at project check-in, just before the fair. They are also posted at bit.ly/4hlandingpage. Please plan for label space, especially if you are exhibiting a poster project.



Tentative Judging Schedule

The schedule below will serve as the tentative judging schedule for static (non-animal) exhibits. In effort to save travel time for judges, we often “double-stack” judges, meaning they may be paid by the 4-H Fair Board to judge one project at 9 am and another at noon or perhaps they are hired to judge two smaller projects in the same time slot such as Garden and Floriculture at 9 am. Please be patient with the judges as they work through multiple exhibits and projects. Project Superintendents will do their best to make sure you have a chance to talk to the judge, if you are present on judging day. Just be sure to let your Superintendent know you are around!

You may be thinking...I already enrolled my one steer, two pigs, and an Arts and Crafts project, why do I have to enter this again? Well, you may only have two pigs, but what about the kid who entered 12 by May 15th? They can't bring them all, so we're asking you to simply finalize your entries with us.

Now is your chance to tell us exactly what your exhibit looks like or which animal you plan to actually show. This is where you will tell us that your rabbit needs to show in the Solid Holland Lop Junior Buck class and that your Sewing project is a non-wearable. We're down to the details now!

Please be sure to include all showmanship classes you intend to participate in also. If this is done now, it will save you time when you get to the fair. Looking forward to seeing all of your awesome exhibits very soon!

EARNING A RETURN ON YOUR 4-H INVESTMENT: 4-H LIVESTOCK AUCTION OR BACK A 4-HER CHOOSE ONE OR THE OTHER, BUT NOT BOTH

Livestock Auction

- Who participates? 4-Hers in grades 3-12 who show livestock at the Steuben County 4-H Fair and does not participate in Back a 4-Her.
- What is the livestock auction? A premium only auction for members to sell one animal or livestock product (milk/cheese, eggs) and earn a return on their investment in 4-H.
- When is the auction? Thursday, June 26, 10 am
- Where is the auction? Rensch Hall
- How do I elect to do this? When entering your animals in livestock classes, just answer the questions.

Back a 4-Her

- Who participates? Any Steuben County 4-Her in grades 3-12 exhibiting a static project (Event Center) and does not participate in the livestock auction.

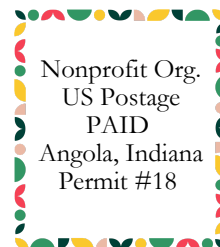
