
Clover Extravaganza! Saturday, April 13 6-8 p.m. at 4-H Building

Regular 4-H state fee is \$15 per 4-Her. The maximum fee for families is \$45. I.e. families with more than three 4-Hers pay no more than \$45. There is no additional county 4-H fee for Sullivan County. There are no fees for Mini 4-Hers. Make checks payable to Purdue CES Ed Fund.

Sheep and goat tagging and weigh in will be Sunday, April 28, 2-4 pm.

RFID Tag (required for state fair)-\$2.50

DNA Envelopes (required for state fair) due May 30 to state 4-H office.

Beef tag/weigh-in date

Beef tag day will be April 10, 3:00-5 pm at the beef barn. Steers and commercial heifers are required to be tagged.

County Tags—\$1.50

RFID Tag (required for state fair)-\$2.50

DNA Envelopes (required for state fair) due May 30 to state 4-H office.

Reminder– county ID tags for goats, sheep, and beef must be purchased on the day of tagging and cannot be purchased in the office after tag day. RFID tags will continue to be sold after weigh in.




