### STUDY ABROAD IN IRELAND- LEADING AND LEARNING

### ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE PRESENTATIONS: NATIONAL & STATEWIDE

# COMMUNITY CHILDCARE

PURDUE EXTENSION IS ENHANCING CHILDCARE SUPPORT BY ADDRESSING THE NEEDS OF PROVIDERS, OFFERING RELEVANT TRAINING, AND FOSTERING CONNECTIONS WITHIN THE CHILDCARE COMMUNITY. THESE EFFORTS AIM TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF CHILDCARE, ACCESS TO RESOURCES, AND PROFESSIONAL NETWORKS. CHILDCARE PROVIDERS OFTEN WORK IN ISOLATION, FACING CHALLENGES IN IDENTIFYING AND UTILIZING AVAILABLE RESOURCES.

#### **NEW ADDITION TO THE COMMUNITY!**

Over the past six months, the Purdue Extension Community Childcare Team has been dedicated to identifying childcare needs and providing support to both providers and families across the Wabash Heartland region, including Tippecanoe County. In collaboration with key local partners — including YWCA, Tippecanoe County Extension, lvy Tech, Lafayette Adult Resource Academy, Latino Center for Wellness and Education, Child Care Resource and Referral, INAEYC, Right Steps, and Greater Lafayette Commerce — the team has been actively engaging the community and assessing childcare needs.

On March 7th, the team took part in the Latino Business Expo, engaging with the Latino community and expanding connections. Additionally, the team has developed a proposal for a new mentoring program aimed at supporting both licensed and unlicensed childcare providers, including in-home, center-based, and ministry-based programs. This program is expected to launch by Fall of this year.

#### **SCHOOL PROGRAMMING**

During the month of March, Tammy shared the CATCH Program with 3rd grade students at Woodland and Mayflower Elementary. Students were excited to prepare healthy snacks at the end of each lesson. Veggie wraps and fruit smoothies were among the favorites with several students trying new fruits and vegetables for the first time (Spinach, avocados, and mango). Students also learned how to "investigate" nutrition facts labels to help identify healthier food choices.

Jessica was busy sharing the Teen Cuisine Program with 7th and 8th grade students at Benton Central Jr High. Students were engaged in activities that reinforced recipe reading, kitchen equipment identification, and label reading. During snack preparation, students practiced cutting techniques and measuring skills. Slicing apples and creating a fruit dip (yogurt/orange juice) was one of their favorites.

In April, Tammy wrapped up the CATCH series with Mayflower and Woodland, and began another six lesson series with Miller, Glen Acres, and Murdock Elementary. Students not only learned how to make healthier food/drink choices, but also learn the importance of limiting screen time to ensure adequate "move" time. One the favorites snacks with this group included Eating the Rainbow (sampling fruits of all different colors: blackberries, pomegranates, mango, kiwi, cantaloupe, honey dew melon).

Jessica continued Teen Cuisine lessons with a second group of 7th and 8th graders at Benton Central and began CATCH lessons with 4th grade students at Earhart Elementary. During the beverage lesson, students were shocked after investigating the amounts of sugar in sodas. In addition, students learned the amount of fruit juice in fruit drinks is located at the top of the nutrition facts label. (Look for 100%).
