SUPPORTING FUTURE PROFESSIONALS

This partnership not only supported student learning but also contributed valuable insights into how nutrition professionals can work at the community level to make a difference.

BE HEART SMART PROGRAM

With the generous support of the Tippecanoe County Health Department and Health First Indiana (HFI) grant funding, Brock brought the Be Heart Smart program directly to the community. Participants learned practical, evidence-based strategies to reduce their risk of heart disease and improve cardiovascular health through diet, lifestyle, and behavior change.

BECOME A 4-H MEMBER IN TIPPECANOE COUNTY

Enrollment for Indiana 4-H begins October 1st and members are encouraged to be enrolled by January 15th to receive important updates. Drop/Add deadline for livestock and non-livestock projects will be May 15th.

The 4-H program fee is \$15 per child, and \$45 max per family. The program fees cover insurance, project curriculum development, and club enrichment activities.

The same enrollment dates will apply to Mini 4-H(K-2). However, there is no county program fee for Mini 4-H.

Will attended a couple of conferences in September to continue refining his skills as an educator. He spent a day in Indianapolis at the Indiana Youth Institute Conference, where he listened to speakers talk about AI in education and even got some hands-on experience with a few Al applications. Later in the month he attended the state 4-H Youth Staff Conference in Muncie, where he got to connect with 4-H Youth Educators and learned about all of the great 4-H programs happening around the state. If the Tippecanoe county 4-Hers want, he would love to replicate a couple like the "Golf Academy" and "NFL in the Classroom". He finished up the month helping with a soils contest in Montgomery county, and doing an Ag to Athletics program at Prairie Crossing Elementary School. Along with Benton County's 4-H Educator Dilynn Harmon and Regional 4-H Extension Administrator Laura

Johnson, the team worked with Prairie Crossing's 6th grade classes. They introduced them to a Turf Management Football Relay to show the students how agriculture is used in the sport of football.

Will's October has been full of outreach programming. He started going to Bauer Family Resource's afterschool program, doing his Ag to Athletics program with the students introducing them to physics, marketing, football, and agility. He went back to Benton County to do an Ag to Athletics program with Otterbein Elementary's 3rd graders. There, he and Dilynn Harmon (Benton County's 4-H Educator) led the students in a "design their own mini golf hole" activity. The 3rd graders ended the day creating a classroom sized mini golf hole, using items brought by the educators and others found in the classrooms, and each student got a chance to putt for a hole-in-one. He also got to do a craftier Ag to Athletics program with White County's Junior Leaders after they finished their tour of Purdue's campus. The Junior Leaders were able to plant some grass seed, design their own soccer socks, and sew together a paper-balloon football while learning about the jobs of a Collegiate Superintendent of Turf Management and the factory that makes the NFL's footballs in Ada, OH.

Will is also spending some time traveling for professional development this month. He took a trip to attend the Elkhart County 4-H Golf Management Academy and learn from Corey Sharp and Sthele Greybar about the partnership they formed with Ryan Cummings and Elcona Country Club. At the end of the month he will fly out to Atlanta, GA to attend the National 4-H Conference.

BECOME A JUNIOR LEADER!

Junior Leaders is a project that is offered through 4-H for any member that is in Grade 7 or above. Junior Leaders is based on community service opportunities, especially related to the 4-H program and the county fair. Junior Leaders also serve as mentors and role models for younger 4-H members by interacting with them and sharing their experiences with them.

In order to complete the Junior Leaders project, you need to gain 100 points or more. Junior Leaders earn points by volunteering at different events and attending meetings, approximately one hour of time equals 10 points. Additionally, if a Junior Leader earns more than 125 points, they qualify for the Junior Leader Achievement Trip.

Growing Knowledge and Community Through Gardening

Extension Educators across Tippecanoe County have been hard at work cultivating both plants and people this fall. 4-H Youth Development Educator Dee Nicley, along with Agriculture and Natural Resources (ANR) Educators Adam Tyler and Jon Charlesworth, have been leading training sessions for a group of 25 Extension Master Gardener interns.

Classes, held Thursday evenings from 6–9 p.m. since August 28th, will continue through December 18th. So far, participants have explored topics such as plant and soil science, vegetable and fruit gardening, herbaceous ornamentals, insects, weeds, and pesticide safety. Upcoming sessions will cover plant disease, invasive species, woody ornamentals, lawn care, and animal pests. Interns will take their final exam on December 11th, followed by a graduation ceremony on December 18th to celebrate their hard work and dedication.

Meanwhile, Adam Tyler, one of
Tippecanoe County's ANR Educators and
a member of the Western Extension team,
has been actively engaging with the
community this fall. "This past month was
busy with questions coming in as we
approach the season," Adam shared. He
visited several homeowners to assist with
habitat and tree selection, herbicide
damage on fruit trees, and other plant
health concerns. "It's been great to
interact with the residents of Tippecanoe

County, and I'm looking forward to continuing to work with Jon to bring valuable resources and education to our community."

Together, these educators are growing more than gardens, they're cultivating knowledge, collaboration, and a stronger connection between Purdue Extension and the residents of Tippecanoe County.

Looking ahead, the statewide virtual Extension Master Gardener Intern Training will begin after the first of the year. This course will be conducted via Webex every Tuesday evening from 6:30–8:30 p.m., February 3 through May 5, 2026. Participants will also join a weekly Local Connection Zoom meeting lasting one hour per week, with the specific day and time to be determined.
