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

Please find attached an application form for a \$1,000 scholarship offered through the Tippecanoe County Extension Homemakers Association. The applicant must be a graduating high school senior in 2024-2025 and must have a family member as a current member of any Tippecanoe County Extension Homemaker Club. The applicant must be admitted to a full-time course of study at an accredited two- or four-year college, university, or vocational school.

Scholarship selection will be based on the applicant's record of leadership and community service.

You will find information on the application form that states criteria for selection. Deadline for application is 4:30 p.m. March 1, 2025. The \$1,000 scholarship check will be made payable directly to the student and presented on May 20 at the 2025 Tippecanoe Extension Homemaker Achievement Event. The awardee will be expected to give a twominute speech in acceptance of the award.

GUIDELINES FOR MAILBOX MEMBERSHIP Submitted by Nancella Dobbins, county treasurer

There have been some questions recently about Mailbox Membership. Below is the explanation of guidelines from the State IEHA.

Mailbox is not a Club. Mailbox members are a welcome, essential part of Extension Homemakers. Mailbox membership was created for Extension Homemakers who were active but unable to attend club meetings. This membership allows them to stay informed and involved (via Home Echoes publication). It was also created for people who are in a stage of life with family/job obligations which makes them too busy to participate in club activities but who will become more active when life's obligations change. Mailbox is also a way for less active members to stay informed about what the County is doing (via Home Echoes publication).

- ⇒ Mailbox members pay \$10 dues by April (in March treasurer will mail a renewal form to all current Mailbox members; they return that form and their \$10 to treasurer).
- ⇒ Mailbox members joining for the first time after April 1 until March 31 of the following year will be recorded as a new member immediately and will receive the next published Home Echoes. Members who joined after April will be recognized at the Achievement Event the following calendar year. The official record of years of service will be kept in the Extension Office database.
- ⇒ Mailbox members are welcome and encouraged to attend/participate in any County event sponsored by Extension Homemakers.
- \Rightarrow Mailbox members may hold county offices, with the exception of County President.
- ⇒ According to State IEHA guidelines, a Club that has been dissolved cannot retain its Club name; thus, those remaining members who so desire can join another club and have their membership transferred; or can be recorded as a Mailbox member.

I hope this helps to explain Mailbox membership. An individual would not be a member of a Named Club and Mailbox at the same time. A member of extension homemakers can be a member of more than one club, as many are when it comes to specialty clubs like Choral and Quilt.
